DAYTON, O. The majority of students at the University of Dayton are adhering to the Legion of Decency pledge according to the religious survey for 1935-36, which has just been published.

To the question, "Do you live up to your pledge of the Legion of Decency?" 78 per cent of those replying answered in the affirmative, 13 per cent in the negative, while three per cent declared they did not take the pledge, and four admitted they fulfilled the pledge "sometimes."

LONDON—A patent has been granted here to a priest for a new method of lighting charcoal for use in thurbles. An incandescent filament lights the charcoal evenly, it is claimed, and the glowing charcoal is transferred to the thurble simply, lighted side up.

Christmas Eve Plight of Holy Family Re-enacted in Spain

A beautiful Christmas custom long kept in Spain is that which the Spaniards called a Posada, or Holy Procession. It re-enacts the wanderings of the Blessed Virgin and St. Joseph seeking shelter on that first Christmas Eve.

Usually, the procession consists of a group of children carrying statues of the Blessed Mother and St. Joseph, followed by adults carrying candles. The procession moves from house to house, asking at each to be taken in. At no house does the request meet with a response.

When the Church is reached the request is made again, and here a place is sought where the children of the procession replies, "It is I, Mary, Queen of Heaven, who begs a place to lay her head for the night."

Immediately the doors of the church are thrown wide open, and the procession enters, moves down one of the aisles, and comes to a halt before a side altar, where a representation of the Manger has been set. The people all kneel and join in prayer. As the prayers are nearly finished, an image of the Christ Child is placed in the Manger, the candles are lighted on all sides and sing hymns to the New Born King.

Calendar Of Feasts: Sunday, December 13. — ST. LUCY, virgin, martyr, after her mother had been miraculously restored to health, consecrated her virginity to Christ. A young man to whom she promised in marriage accused her as Christian to the heathen. A fire kindled around her was, through miraculous intervention, prevented from harming her and she was finally dispatched with the sword at forehead to the tomb of St. Agatha, when her mother was cured.

Monday, December 14. — ST. NICHOLAS, Archbishop, and his companions, the three St. Nicholas, was the Bishop of Rheims who was killed by the barbarians who plundered that city in the fifth century.

Tuesday, December 15. — ST. MILES, abbot of the monastery in Micy in the time of Clovis. During a terrible famine he fed nearly the whole city of Orleans with bread from his monastery without perceptibly reducing it. After governing his monastery for ten years, he died as he had lived, in the odor of sanctity, in the year 450.

Wednesday, December 16. — ST. EUSEBIUS, Bishop, was born of a noble family on the island of Sardinia. He was taken to Rome by his father and later to fill it. He fought courageously against the heretics who had him banished to Sythopolis and thence to Upper Thebais in Egypt where he suffered grievously. He died in the year 371.

Thursday, December 17. — ST. OLYMPIAS was the glory of the widows of the Eastern Church. After the death of her husband 20 days after her marriage, she resolved to consecrate her life to prayer and to devote her fortune to the poor. She was appointed deaconess by Neorgatus, Archbishop of Constantinople. She suffered great persecution and crowned a virtuous life by a saintly death about the year 410.

Friday, December 18. — ST. GALEAN, Bishop, came from Rome with St. Dionysius of Paris about the middle of the third century. In spite of great opposition he succeeded in making converts to the faith, although constantly in danger of death at the hands of the pagans.
