

700 MEN ATTEND CHRISTMAS MASSES AT REFORMATORY

CARDINAL INSTALLS Intentions For Church Unity

BISHOP GUILFOYLE Octave Next Month Announced

ALTOONA, PA.—(NC)—With His Eminence Dennis Cardinal Dougherty, Archbishop of Philadelphia, officiating, the Most Rev. Richard T. Guilfoyle was installed as third Bishop of Altoona at impressive ceremonies held in the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament.

An inspiring sermon, in which he stressed the fact that today more than ever before, the Bishop is a shepherd of souls in a world convulsed was delivered by the Very Rev. Thomas Plasmann, O.F.M., President of St. Bonaventure's College, Allegany, N. Y. from which institution Bishop Guilfoyle was graduated with highest honors in 1914.

Cardinal Dougherty 10 years ago as Bishop of Buffalo, had ordained Bishop Guilfoyle to the priesthood. The Most Rev. John Mark Cannon, Bishop of Erie, under whom Bishop Guilfoyle had served for 15 years as Secretary, 13 of them also as "vicar general" of the Diocese of Erie, was celebrant of the Pontifical Mass.

BISHOP APPOINTED PREFECT APOSTOLIC

VATICAN CITY—The Most Rev. William T. Finnamore, B.V.D., Auxiliary Bishop of Manila, Philippines, has been named Prefect Apostolic of Mindoro, Philippines.

Monsignor Finnamore, who was born at Muehlhausen, Germany, December 11, 1888, has been Auxiliary Bishop of Manila since February 8, 1936. He entered the Society of the Divine Word in 1909, was ordained in 1910, and was assigned to St. Charles's, Baltimore, September 24, 1911. After six years of work as a missionary in the Philippines, he served as Prefect of Lungs and Creek in the Diocese of Zamboanga in Mindoro from January, 1918, until February, 1922. He returned to the United States to study at the University of St. Thomas, St. Louis, Mo., where he received a Bachelor of Divinity degree in 1923. He was the first member of the Society of the Divine Word in the Philippines.

Elevated in 1933

The rank of Prothonotary Apostolic was conferred on Msgr. Flynn April 18, 1933, by Pope Pius XI because of his outstanding achievements in the field of Indian missions and education.

Msgr. Flynn was ordained at Mount St. Mary's Seminary, Emmetsburg, Md. June 15, 1915. The next month he was appointed as assistant of St. John the Baptist Church in Pittsburgh, and held that post until 1918.

From January 1918 to May 1924 he was assistant pastor of the Holy Trinity Church in Pittsburgh and was the appointed pastor of the Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions, Washington, D. C. After a year as lecturer, Msgr. Flynn was also director of the Marquette League and at the same time carried on his activities as editor of almost the quarterly publication of the organization.

Gets Purple in 1931

Pope Pius named him domestic prelate with the title of monsignor in November of 1931, while he held the position of pastor of Holy Trinity Church in Spokane, Wash. conferred upon the priest the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws in recognition of his work among the American Indians.

Msgr. Flynn aided in the establishment of many Indian schools and hospitals and appeared many times before the Indian Commission at Washington to urge legislation beneficial to the reservations.

As Prothonotary Apostolic Msgr. Flynn was permitted to wear the mitre, the crozier and a ring the same as a Bishop. He might also celebrate solemn pontifical mass four times during the year.

Surviving are four brothers: Joseph J. Flynn, James M. Flynn and Thomas J. Flynn, all in the city and Francis X. Flynn of Brooklynn.

Services were offered at all masses in St. Ann's and St. Ignace Loyola churches Christmas Day.

A week ago, according to the family, Father Haughton suffered a heart attack but recovered and Christmas Eve visited relatives' homes and appeared in unusually good health. Relatives and he was cheerful and was looking forward to Christmas with the family.

Father Haughton was born in Hornell, May 1, 1888, the son of the late Robert T. and Mary Theresa (Beilan) Haughton. He attended St. Ann's Parochial School, Hornell High School, and later entered St. Andrews Preparatory School in Rochester. He completed his work for the priesthood in St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester and was ordained by Bishop Thomas F. Hickey in June, 1919. He sang his first Mass in St. Ann's Church. He was widely known by residents of all denominations.

His first assignment was at Immaculate Conception parish in Ithaca. Later he held assistant pastorates in Seneca Falls, Waterloo and Auburn.

While in Ithaca, he was adviser to the Newman Class of Cornell University, composed of Catholic students.

His survivors are two sisters, Miss Mary D. Haughton and Mrs. George Dewey, both of this city, and a brother, William F. Haughton of Fultonville, N. Y., several nieces and nephews.
