Cardinal Dougherty Embraced on Arrival In Vatican City

VATICAN CITY-With regard to his illness he regrets only that it compels him to limit his activities in behalf of the Church. His Holiness Pope Pius XI said when he received in audience His Eminence Dennis Cardinal Dougherty, Archbishop of Philadelphia.

Cardinal Dougherty, who arrived in Rome Saturday evening is going to the Thirty-third International Eucharistic Congress, to be held at Manila, February 3 to 7, as the Legate of Pope Pius XI.

Speaking from his bed, the Holy Father told Cardinal Dougherty that he wishes the most successful result for the Manila Eucharistic Congress, especially for the pacification and unification of world. The Philippines, His Holiness added, constitute the only Christian nation in the Far East and consequently, are peculiarly adapted to be center of unifica-
