

Hold Rites For Bishop Gallagher

Detroit Mourns Beloved Prelate at Impressive Funeral Rites

DETROIT—A sorrowing city witnessed the heart-felt grief as funeral services were held in the Cathedral of St. Peter & Paul for the Most Rev. Michael J. Gallagher, Bishop of Detroit.

In the presence of more than a score of members of the hierarchy, the clergy, religious and lay, the Most Rev. J. McMichael, O.P., Archbishop of Cincinnati, officiated at the Requiem Mass.

An eloquent sermon in eulogy of the late prelate was delivered by the Most Rev. Joseph Schrembs, Bishop of Cleveland, for many years the close personal friend of Bishop Gallagher.

At the Mass in the Cathedral the assembled school children in every parish of the diocese at the call of their beloved Cardinal, whose unexpected death last Wednesday night had shocked his thousands of admirers throughout the nation.

VATICAN CITY—As the improvement in his condition continues, His Holiness Pope Pius XI rejoices profoundly in the possibility that he may intensify his daily work, especially that he may increase his audiences.

His Holiness spent all of Sunday afternoon in his wheelchair, being taken to the third gallery on the courtyard of St. Damascus to enjoy the sun.

Monday, Pope Pius received His Eminence Eugenio Cardinal Agelli, Papal Secretary of State; Archbishop Celso Costantini, Secretary of the Sacred Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith; Archbishop Filippo Cortesi, Papal Nuncio to Poland; and the Most Rev. Chidine-Maryam Cassa, a native Ethiopian Bishop.

The Holy Father received in a farewell audience on Sunday the Most Rev. Clement Augustino von Dalem, Bishop of Muenster, and the Most Rev. Conrad von Preysing, Bishop of Berlin, who were returning to Germany. His Holiness engaged the German prelates in a long and most cordial conversation.

Fr. Coughlin Back on Air With Tribute To Bishop

DETROIT—With a memorial address for the late Most Rev. Michael J. Gallagher, Bishop of Detroit, the Rev. Charles E. Coughlin, noted radio speaker, returned to the air here Sunday. His address was the first of a new series of Sunday broadcasts.

"On his last trip to the Shrine of the Little Flower some few days ago," Father Coughlin said, "Bishop Gallagher expressed his desire that I should resume my broadcasting activities immediately, primarily to expound the doctrine of Christ and to expose the fallacies of Communism."

"Given though I was reluctant to resume my place before the microphone, I regard it as a duty to address you today and henceforth regularly, to fulfill the last wish of my Bishop, my counselor, my guide and my friend."

"At least a thousand times, without exaggeration, Bishop Gallagher encouraged me to preach the doctrine of Christ as expounded by the heroic Leo XIII. Some 40 years ago he said: 'I do not regard
