Asks Move To Amend Law to Add City Pupils

That steps be taken to amend the state free school law so that it would apply to urban children of private and parochial schools as well as those in the rural communities, was asked by Monroe County legislator by Representative George B. Kelly, this week.

This was revealed in a letter from Congressman Kelly to State Senator Emmett L. Doyle of Rochester.

An action has been started by a Joseph Lewis in New York to have the courts decide that interpretation by the New York City Board of Education in favor of urban children be declared illegal. If the courts uphold the New York City Board, amendment by the State Legislature will be unnecessary and the original intention of the measure will be carried out.

As State Senator from Monroe County, Congressman Kelly secured passage and executive approval of an act by the New York Legislature that "any transportation provided for school children shall be available to all," which the congressman says now is being applied generally only to rural communities in Monroe County, and is not making transportation available to all children in Rochester.

The Board of Education in Rochester has held that the law does not apply to the city generally. Mr. Kelly has written Mr. Doyle asking him to introduce amendments to the act so that its original intent may be carried out fully. This will provide that urban children attending private and parochial schools will be given equal transportation rights with those of rural sections.

NAZARETH COLLEGE LISTS LECTURES BY NOTED AUTHORS

Dr. Langfellow Fiske, former editorial writer on the staff of the St. Louis "Times" and feature writer for the "Chicago Journal" and now a contributor to national periodicals including "America" and the "Commonwealth."

Heinz C. White, author of "No Walls With Heads" and "A Watch in the Night." Miss White received her A.B. and M.A. at Radcliffe and her Ph.D. at Wisconsin University.

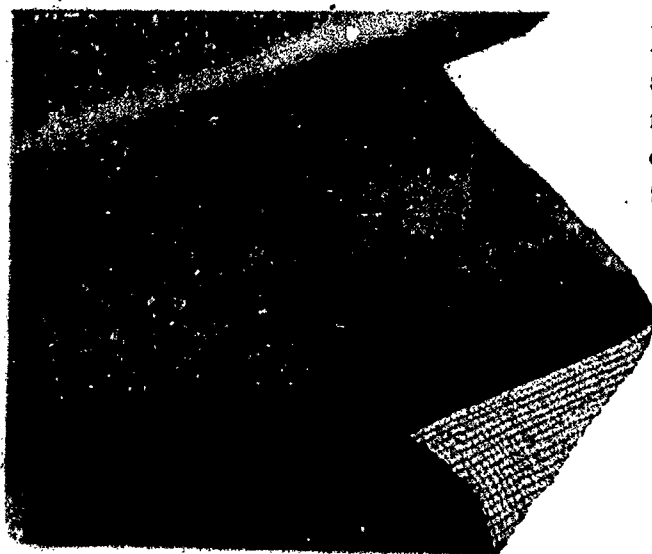
