### Nuns Are In Charge

In direct charge of the Crusaders are more than 300 nun: representing five teaching orders.

#### District Divisions Made

In each district are three divisions. The first is of schools with enrollment of eligible pupils up to 75, the second from 76 to 125 and the third from 126 to 250.

A special division has been established for schools with cligible enrollments of 251 or more.

Eligible enrollments cover all students from the fifth to the eighth grades inclusive in grammar schools and the entire four years in high school.
