Final tribute to Sister M. Francis Adelaide Cunningham, who died Monday morning at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, was paid at services held Wednesday morning in the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse Chapel, Pittsford.

Solemn High Mass of Requiem was celebrated by the Rev. Dr. William T. Byrne, pastor of Immaculate Conception parish, Ithaca, who also gave the final blessing.

Assisting were: Deacon, the Rev. Joseph McDonnell; subdeacon, the Rev. Michael Kleiman, C.S.S.R.

Interment was in the Sisters' plot at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery. Sister M. Francis Adelaide was teaching in the Immaculate Conception School, Ithaca, when taken ill. She was in the eighth year of her religious life, having entered the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph at Rochester in 1929.

Prior to going to Ithaca, Sister M. Francis Adelaide taught for three years at St. Francis De Sales School in Geneva.

Besides her parents, Francis Cunningham and Frances Adelaide Cunningham of Holy Rosary parish, Rochester, she leaves three sisters: Mrs. Albert E. Montville, Syracuse; Mrs. A. Brundage of Niagara Falls, and Mrs. Charles Ross of Rochester, and two brothers, Charles and Joseph, both of Rochester.

Her mother was a former Ithaca Conception Church choir, and her grandmother, Mrs. Benjamin Milks, still resides there.

President Norbert F. Trabold appointed Loren G. Wells chairman of a committee which will lay plans for the celebration of the 50th anniversary.


