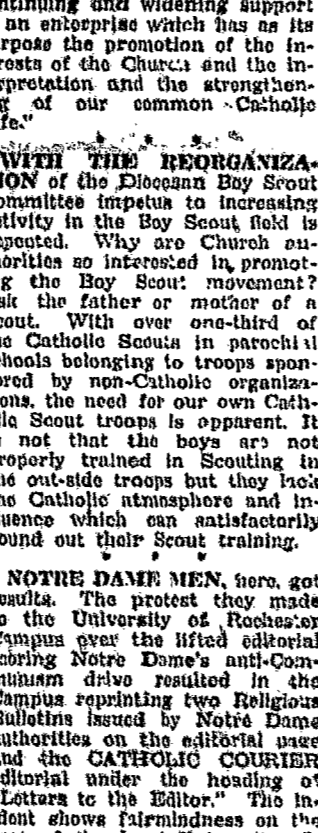
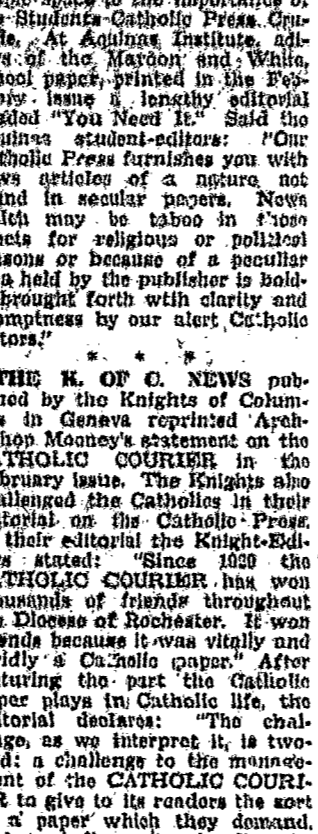
WITH THE REORGANIZATION of the Diocesan Boy Scout Council, the Boy Scout movement?
