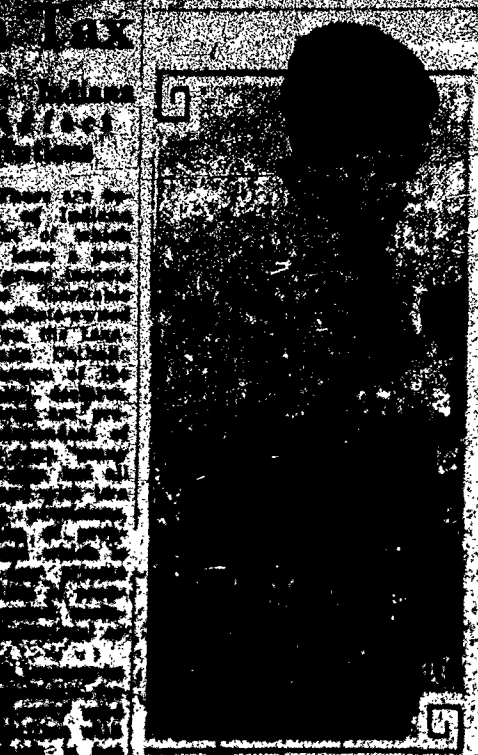


Bills Fr. Hubbard To Seek New Land In Arctic

WASHINGTON—The Rev. Fr. Hubbard, S. J., of Santa Clara University and internationally famous "Glacier Priest," is enthusiastically confident that he is going to discover "the only remaining piece of unexplored land on the globe."

For Child Labor Amendment

Dear Editor: As a Catholic, a working man and a member of your paper, I wish to express my disappointment in the attempt of the Catholic bishops of New York State to prevent passage of the Child Labor Amendment to the Constitution.

If it were not for their unanimity of opinion I would say they reminded me unpleasantly of the opinions of the Supreme Court of the U. S. as now constituted.

The Christian gentlemen who have moved their mills and factories from the North to the South did so because the State Laws of the South permitted them to hire little children while their former adult employees went on relief.

It is my belief that Mr. John A. Ryan of the Catholic University in Washington by virtue of the years he has spent in research, on questions such as this, and because God has endowed him with a brilliant intellect and because his motives are wholly above suspicion has a clearer right to speak for the Catholic Church than any other priest in the U. S. and he is for the amendment.

In conclusion, I wish to call your attention to the present deplorable situation in Spain and to venture the opinion that the hierarchy of Spain by their unwillingness to face facts, contributed more than any other single factor to the tragedy—conditions existing there today.

Our comrades in the United States have acted correctly in taking the initiative in "RATIFY" such a party. We must take care that this party should appear the spontaneous development of the masses themselves.

The question of organizing a Farmer-Labor Party and its program should take place at a national convention.

It is necessary to state that the organization of a mass party of workers, a so-called Farmer-Labor Party, would best suit American conditions. Such a party would be a specific form of a popular front party in America to oppose the parties of the trusts and banks and growing Fascism.

And the "New American" Communist publication in its July, 1936, number, quoted Mr. Minnesota Congressman as saying "What we must have is fifty disciplined Farmer-Labor Congressmen who will fight. They must challenge the Supreme Court and strip it of its power."

Assisting Communism in the educational field also is "The American Federation of Teachers" which is said to have a membership of 30,000 with locals in 50 American cities and towns. I would be unfair to place the blame of "Communist" or "un-American" on all the members of the Federation, but the fact is that the organization is warmly sympathetic towards Communism and red publications are lavish in their praise of it.

I cannot refrain from quoting from the instructive little pamphlet, "It Is Happening Here," published by the "Our Sunday Visitor Press" of Huntington, Indiana. It there says: "We have a right to believe that the organization known as the American Federation of Teachers had strong Communist leanings. It should
