PEN INTIMATE CHATS WITH THE PALS
CATHOLIC GIRL

My dear Girls: "Since Ash Wednesday I've been promising Susan Russell to say a few words to you, but I'm such a poor hand at talking that at best I know it'll be to talk to you about something I know for I'm not learned in books, so I thought maybe you'd be interested in hearing about the early Lenten days.

I was thinking today of the first Lent after we started for the longest part of it was spent on the lonely trail in a covered wagon. The wilderness was all around us. At night the wolves howled and the coyotes barked as we knelt in our covered wagon and said our stations, our rosary and our special prayers. Sometimes as we looked up at that faraway sky God, too, seemed to be with us, and we trusted, and we won in the end.

"The next year when Lent came around we had our little altar in our cabin, but no church nor chapel was near to light us. No priest of God was near, and this lasted for three more years when one day there rode up to our gate a Catholic priest.

His donkey—a mountain donkey—was stubborn as an army mule, and his saddle bags were covered with dust. He himself was so tired and so travel worn he could scarcely stand. But the joy of having him, I can never tell you.

We had prayed for his coming night and day, and now he was here. We kept him as long as he'd stay, and when he went we gave him all the cooked food and butter-milk he could take, and we took him in the covered wagon to the Big Gap, his donkey being tethered to the trees to the left. He blessed our little cabin and us, and that home was dearer than ever. For Mass had been said there.

HAPPY DAYS

"That was the happiest time of my life. Three years ago, when Father Dan came again to us, there were three green mounds in the lot beside the cabin—three graves for him to bless. Two of my babies, the only two I had, and their father had left the little cabin home. A white wooden cross my husband had made and put in its place when he brought with him three Catholic neighbors from 25 miles away, a mother and her two sons, who are there to this day and who have been such a comfort to us. Father Dan never came without its brought real comfort to us all.

"Before another five years had gone to bless. Two of my babies, that little wooden cross in their told you about was built, with its beams and its rafters, its homemade candles and candlesticks, and much like the one kerocense lamp. My husband had a part in that chapel even though he had gone, for I gave them the little altar his had made, and in its stand in my cabin is the cruce one I made myself.

"The chapel is not very near. It has been there for many a year and it will last for it's made of heart pine, hand-hewn. Now, when Father Dan comes, he'll bless it and leave us for his reward long ago. I go to stay at Tom Collins' cabin
