FENWICK HIGH WINS CATHOLIC COURT TITLE

CHICAGO Fenwick High School, Oak Park, won the National Catholic Tournament at Loyola University gymnasium here by defeating Catholic High of Joliet, 30 to 27, before a crowd of 4,000 persons.

The tournament, a 14-year-old custom brings Catholic teams from all parts of the country. The four-day play ended Sunday night.

The Fenwick team also won in the semi-finals by beating St. Patrick's High School of Kankakee 31 to 24 on Saturday. St. Joseph's team of Huntington, W. Va., beat LaSalle of Philadelphia, 22 to 27, and Benedictine High of Richmond, Va. won 12 to 31, over St. Mary's of Anderson, Ind. in the consolation final.

Fenwick High School, established about 10 years ago, is under the direction of the Dominican Fathers.

Auburn Altar Boys Publish Newspaper

AUBURN "Altar Boy Highlights," a publication for and by altar boys of St. Alphonsus Parish has just made its appearance here and has been well received.

The little newspaper, a mimeographed affair, is well edited and carries original drawings to add to its attractiveness.

With the exception of one small item by the Rev. Francis Waterstrat, the entire publication is prepared by the altar boys.

In the first issue, Father Waterstrat in a note to parents called attention to the importance of promptness and neatness.

Short stories, intimate items about the boys, jokes, sports news and inspirational paragraphs comprise the contents of the lively little paper.
