**Msgr. Sheen Answers Communism Claims**

NEW YORK—The letter of a man who accuses the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen, of the Catholic University of America, of "a grave misrepresentation of facts" in his series, "Communism Answers the Questions of a Communist," and cites the "World Almanac" as his authority is printed in the current issue of the Catholic News in this city, together with Monsignor Sheen's reply disproving the accusations.

The objector, M. Divornitski of this city, who says he "feels it my duty to try to enlighten you about certain facts, which I believe can be more readily accepted by a greater number of people with an average amount of intelligence than the distortions given out by you," insists Monsignor Sheen's attention to the "World Almanac" for 1937, which describes Chapter X of the 1936 Soviet Constitution as a Bill of Rights, and says "Citizens are guaranteed the right to work, the right to rest, the right to material security in old age and in the event of illness or incapacity, the right to education, the right to practice any religion or none, the right of freedom of speech, press and assembly, the right of property, of personal home, personal property and correspondence under due process of law."

Monsignor Sheen, in answering Mr. Divornitski's letter, notes that the latter challenges "of the Communist does not give the right to practice religion and propaganda" and "secondly, that Communism does not grant freedom of the press and freedom of speech."

"Ordinarily," Monsignor Sheen adds, "I would answer such a letter by a brief reference to the Soviet Constitution, but since you challenge both the honesty of the Catholic News and my own willingness to consider objections, I beg to reply at length."

Second-Hand Source

"You refute my statements by a quotation from the World Almanac," Monsignor Sheen says to Mr. Divornitski.

"May I remind you that the discussion is not what the World Almanac says about Communism, but rather whether Communism grants in practice the above-mentioned rights. Furthermore, the World Almanac is a second-hand source and a second-hand source is often as unreliable as a second-hand automobile. The sources I mentioned in my article were all Communist and you refute them by an appeal to an almanac."

"But not to get down to each of the two points in question," Monsignor Sheen continues, "I said in my article, and I repeat, that Communism 'does not grant the right to practice religion and propaganda.' The 124 constitution, you quote the World Almanac, and then add triumphantly: 'Without the slightest doubt this completely refutes your statement.'"

"I may say that the World Almanac is a second-hand source and does not use the word 'right' in reference to religion. It uses the weaker word 'recognized.' Monsignor Sheen then quotes the text of Article 124 of the new Soviet Constitution and adds:

Excludes Religious Propaganda

"Notice that Article 124 excludes religious propaganda, which is precisely the point I made in the article. As a matter of fact, the new Constitution, instead of giving an increase of religious liberty, rather than the opposite, Article 124 of the Constitution (amended in 1929) granted 'confessional liberty' whereas the new Constitution replaces 'confessional liberty' by 'worship.'"

"And why? Because 'confessional liberty' means the right to propagandize by 'worship' does not. In other words, Article 124 recognizes 'freedom of worship,' but denies the right to propagandize religion by circulating newspapers, by religious schools or by religious broadcasts, but it does not permit the government to 'propagandize' against religion. Nor does the new Constitution abrogate the law which forbids the teaching of religion to young people under 18 in groups exceeding three in number."

"2. In further proof, let me appeal not to the World Almanac but to a Communist leader who has not yet been executed. I refer to Yaroslavsky, who in 1936 published in Moscow a booklet entitled 'Stalin's Constitution and the Problem of Religion' (OGIZ and GAIZ State Anti-Religious Publishing Co.) in which we read:

"The Constitution grants us the right of religious propaganda, and we will use it in order to strike a more formidable blow at religion. Now I contend that there can be real freedom of religion only when a government allows propaganda for religion, but never propaganda against it."

"You are guaranteed the right in America to drive an automobile, but suppose the Government used its army, its secret service, its press, its radio, its air force to propagandize against the right and to urge that you join the Government's 'Society of Militant Anti-Automobile Drivers'—would you call that freedom? Well, neither do I call it religious freedom nor Communism, nor its religious press and its 'Society of Militant Atheists' to propagandize against religion."

"I know the Constitution says it grants these rights. But so do I know the Constitution says it states that 'freedom of speech and the press' are granted to strengthen the Socialist system," saying that "this means Communism takes
