Checking Your Home

The questions below deal with the fundamentals that make a house a home. Check carefully the condition of your home with this list. Answer the questions "yes" or "no." When you have finished the list, you will have before you a guide to help you plan your own modernization program and in obtaining estimates for the needed work.

1. Foundation walls sound and in good condition?
2. Is the cellar weather-tight, water-tight? Paved?
3. Heating plant, adequate and economical of fuel and labor?
4. Roof weather-tight and without leaks?
5. Exterior walls and trim in good repair?
6. Masonry in good condition?
7. Do you have all the rooms you need?
8. A water-heating system with hot water always on tap?
9. Bathroom facilities sufficient and modern?
10. Modern clothing and refrigeration equipment?
11. Floors modern, attractive, and in good condition?
12. Interior walls and ceilings in good condition?
13. Woodwork, painted?
14. Door and windows weather-tight, easy to operate?
15. Modern efficient built-in laundry equipment?
16. Walls and roof insulation, heat and cold?
17. A very round lot, glazed and screened?
18. Enough closet space built-in, convenient?
19. Do you have a fireplace?
20. Chimneys, drawing properly and in fire-safe condition?
21. All stairways, convenient, safe, well lighted?
22. Bathrooms, conveniently planned and finished in sound condition?
23. House wired for gas and wired for electricity?
24. Sufficient electric outlets and up-to-date fixtures?
25. Grounds properly landscaped, planted on closed?

The above check list can serve as a barometer to indicate the real value of your house as a dwelling, considered in terms of modern convenience and livability. Any answer "no" tells you where to apply modernization in order to protect your equity—your investment—your pleasure, pride, and comfort in your home.


