VEREIN TO MARK ANNIVERSARY OF TWO ENCYCLICALS

In celebration of the anniversary of the issuance of the two great labor encyclicals of Pope Leo XIII and Pope Pius XI, a joint meeting of the Rochester Branches, Catholic Central Veron or America and the National Catholic Women's Union will be held Sunday afternoon, May 16 at St. Joseph's Hall at 3 o'clock.

The Rev. Frederick Wala, assistant pastor of St. Anthony's Church, will speak on the two encyclicals. Election of delegates to the national convention of the Catholic Central Veron to be held at Hartford, Conn., August 14 to 18 and to the state convention at Schenectady over Labor Day weekend will take place at the meeting.

The meeting Sunday will review action of the Central Veron in opposing the Fife bill on the ground that the measure is too comprehensive and tends toward the totalitarian state. The Fife bill is an act to amend the general municipal law in relation to aid in paying the expenses of child-bearing.

BEER, ALE PRICE BOOST EXPLAINED

Due to the increased cost of labor and materials the five Rochester breweries this week announced a 7 per cent increase in the price of beer and ale.

The announcement was made in the name of the American Geneesee and Waterbury and Standard Brewing companies.

The scarcity of grains has caused a 50 per cent jump in the price the brewery officials pointed out. A recent agreement between the brewery workers and the grain growers provided for a 10 per cent wage increase and a 2 per cent increase in every week's vacation with pay.

The cost of beer by the case is now \$2.15 compared with the same price of \$1.50.

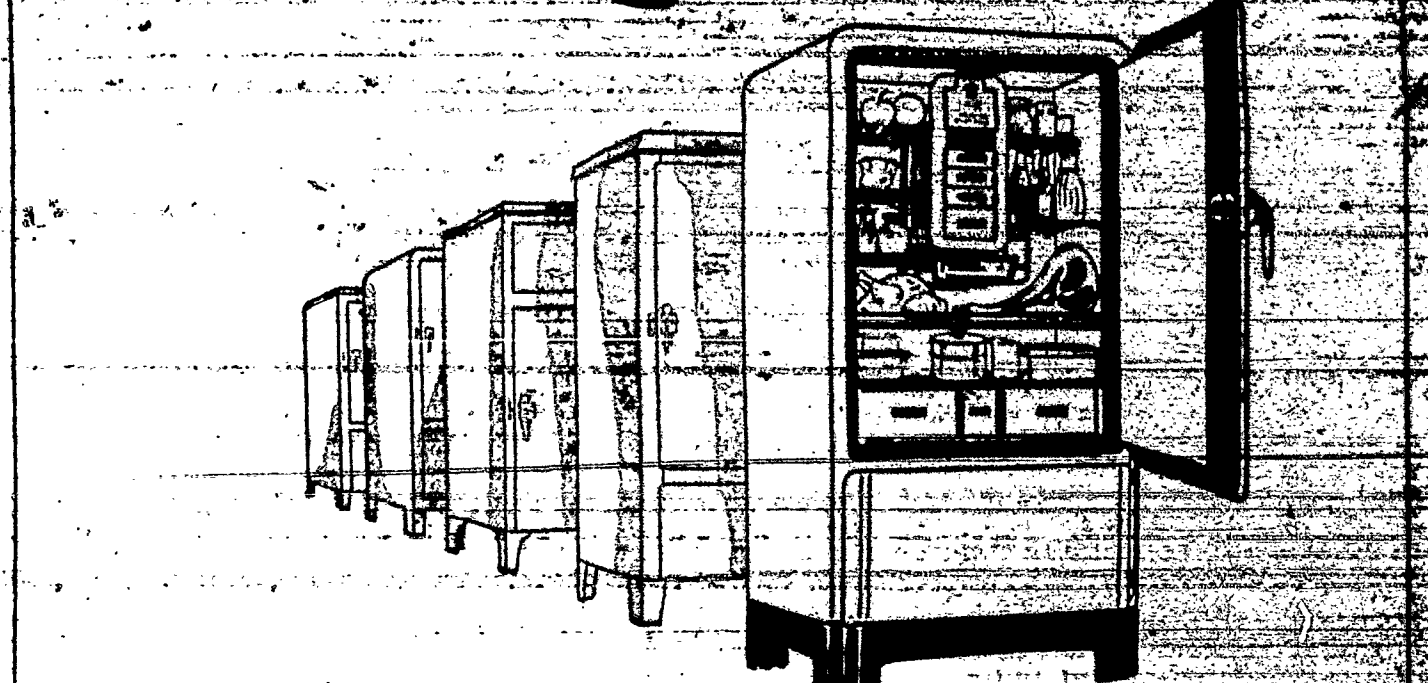
