### CAPE COD COTTAGE

THE simple lines of the "Cape Cod" cottage make it a favorite with many small home builders. In this design, waste space, plenty of room for the average family, and economical construction assure the features many prospective home owners seek.

The front door opens into a well-planned hall, which allows easy access to living room, kitchen, and second floor—stepladder for the housewife. Just inside the living room is a large and convenient coat closet. The living room, large and well lighted, looks out upon the street and the privy of the rear garden. The deep bay pleasantly breaks the lines of the room, and adds interest to the exterior. A large colonial fireplace mantel, adequate wall space, and nicely balanced door and window openings make this room easy to furnish comfortably and attractively.

The dining room is also large and well lighted. The kitchen is arranged for efficiency and convenience, with sink and built-in cases near windows, while space is reserved for the range and refrigerator units.

The breakfast alcove and basement stairway are conveniently located at the rear of the house, between the kitchen and dining room. This arrangement is appreciated when guests are in the house and the basement stairs in this location makes utilization of the basement for game room or den an easy matter.

Two bedrooms with three large closets are located on the second floor. The bath is located at the top of the stairs, convenient to both living rooms and bedrooms. As on the first floor, hall space has been reduced to a minimum to make all of the space usable and reduce construction costs.
