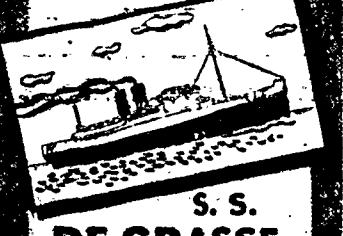

philosophies are based the modern creeds of unlimited sex indulgence, neo-malthusian perversion of nature, by positive contraception, sterilization, whether voluntary or compulsory, abortion, therapeutic or whatever form proposed, and other fads which under semblance of promoting health and happiness, only succeed in the long run in destroying both.

"There is no human necessity which can confer on the doctor the right to take life or to prevent it. As a matter of fact, no method of artificial contraception is known to medicine which is 100 per cent of failure. Whatever legal rights may exist with regard to these now, they may be granted in the future. The Federation asserts that legal rights are not necessarily moral rights, and are not infrequently in direct opposition to God's rights.

The Federation's statement was the result of the American Medical Association officially recognizing birth control.

U. S. Catholic Colleges Graduate Thousands

With the advent of June, commencement exercises in many Catholic colleges and universities were held throughout the nation this week.

Thousands of seniors received the baccalaureate degree, while other students were awarded postgraduate and other advanced degrees. Honorary degrees were conferred upon distinguished persons in all walks of life while addresses to graduates were given by officials, prelates, and other leaders in the civil, ecclesiastical and educational spheres.

WASHINGTON — Seventy-eight graduates received diplomas at the commencement exercises of the Catholic College here, Tuesday. The Most Rev. Richard J. Cullen, Archbishop of Baltimore, presided and the address to the graduates was given by Dr. Joseph J. Kelly, of Hunter College, New York.

CONVENT STATION, N. Y. — The Most Rev. Thomas J. Walsh, Bishop of Newark, presided at the commencement exercises of the College of St. Elizabeth when 70 seniors received degrees. The honorary degree, Doctor of Laws, was conferred upon Dr. James C. Hursey, supervisor of elementary and Junior High School Grades in Jersey City. He also delivered the commencement address.

VILLANOVA, PA. — Degrees were awarded to 148 graduates at Villanova College's commencement exercises.
