Whole Country Turning to Church

It is very rare that we receive news like that contained in the following letter from Archbishop Tikhon of Estonia. If we look at the map of Russia in Europe and travel westward, as the northern end we find the small Republic of Estonia. Up to the people of this country have belonged exclusively to the Russian Orthodox Church. Today the picture is very different. Here is the letter of the Archbishop: "As you know, for a long time there has been a tendency among the Orthodox Estonians to unite with the Catholic Church. In many villages, people have expressed their desire to become Catholics. Already we have twelve young men who are ready for the Seminary to study to be Catholic priests. Recently, two students of the Orthodox Seminary came to me and were received into the Church. I plan to send them to the Russian Seminary in Rome.

"But what is more encouraging is that about half the Orthodox priests have signified their intention of becoming Catholics. You cannot imagine the effect of this news when these priests are received into the Church. I really believe that we are on the eve of a great convert movement in Estonia.

"Recently, I bought a large house and farm in Estonia. This house serves as a place of retreat and study for these converts. The only drawback is that we must have an extension on this house for a Chapel. At the present time, it is almost impossible to find a room sufficiently large for the offering of Holy Mass and the carrying out of the Sacred Liturgy. I spent all my resources in purchasing the house, and now I come to you begging for help to build this Chapel. I can put on the extension for the Chapel for three hundred dollars.

"Believe me when I tell you that the harvest in Estonia is great. I look forward to seeing the great part of the Orthodox Christians in the Catholic Church in a very few years. We must just now take care of these Orthodox priests, who have come into the Church. We must train them in the Catholic life and give them a thorough course in Theology. Some of them are men of great learning and will be ready for their work in a short time.

"We present our readers with this extraordinary opportunity. In the first place, here is a chance for somebody to build a Chapel, a place where the Holy Sacrifice will be offered and where the Blessed Sacrament can be reserved.
