**State Rites Held For Marconi**

**Pope Also Says Mass For Inventor of Wireless**

BOLOGNA, ITALY—Italy gave Senator Guglielmo Marconi a State funeral when his remains were placed in the Marconi family vault here, his birthplace, Friday.

Senator Marconi's body arrived here from Rome, where it had lain in state in the church of Santa Maria degli Angeli, and where thousands of residents of Bologna paid tribute to the memory of the great inventive genius when his body was being borne from the railway station to the ancient monastery church of this city, where the funeral services were held.

High dignitaries of the nation accompanied the Senator's body here upon arrival, the remains were entrusted to the Bologna city officials.

The Governor of Rome, in a procession from the railway station to his church, and again from the church to the family vault. Senator Marconi's remains were transported by the coach which had been used at the funeral of Queen Victoria's mother, of King Victor Emmanuel.

**Royal Family Represented**  
The railway station was adorned with crepe-bordered flags. A group of students of the University of Bologna bore the inventor's body on their shoulders from the train to the waiting hearse. Other university students stood silently at attention. As the cortege moved through the city streets, policemen, militiamen and soldiers lined the route.

Each contingent dipped its colors in salute as the coffin passed. Representatives of the royal family, the government, the Senate, the University of Bologna and other distinguished bodies occupied special places along the way.

The present resting place of Marconi's remains is only a temporary one. The Government is planning the selection of a final resting place for the developer of wireless communication and it is to be a national shrine.

**Posthumous Speech**  
Following Senator Marconi's funeral, the Senate, the University of Bologna and the Marconi Company read over the radio an address which the inventor himself was to have delivered at the dedication of the new Bologna radio broadcasting station.

In this address, Senator Marconi said he foresaw 42 years ago the possibility of sending electric waves great distances, but that he did not hope to be able to achieve the great satisfaction which is being accorded me today. In fact, he said, the possibility of intercepting wireless messages was urged as a "major defect" in the beginning, and "this defect preoccupied me as much that for many years my principal researches were dedicated to its elimination." Nevertheless, his statement added, "this defect was utilized after about 30 years and has become radio that means of reception which daily reaches more than 40,000,000 listeners."

**VATICAN CITY**—His Holiness Pope Pius XI celebrated Mass on Tuesday for the repose of the soul of Senator Guglielmo Marconi, inventor and developer of radio communication, who died that morning.

The Pontifical Academy of Sciences and the staff of the Vatican City radio station sent messages of condolence to Senator Marconi's widow and family.

**AS MEXICAN CHURCH REOPENS**

More than 4,000 jubilant Catholics assembled in the ancient Guadalupe mission church, July 14, at Juarez, State of Chihuahua, to celebrate the first Mass here in more than a year. A portion of those attending the services is shown here, and the celebrant of the Mass, the Rev. Salvador B. Uranga, one of four priests of the diocese who were recently granted a Federal injunction against State authorities.



**MEXICANS JAIL 8 ON CHARGE OF OPENING CHURCHES**

MEXICO CITY—Eight residents of Las Casas, Capital of Chihuahua, were arrested and placed in a Federal military prison the same day, charged with forcibly opening the doors of churches in that city.

They have sought an injunction on the ground that the reasons for their arrest were not made known to them in the manner required by law. They state that although they are good Catholics, they had no part in the opening of the churches and that they are the victims of political vengeance.

Two churches were forcibly opened in Chihuahua last year, but the State has been without registered priests since March, 1933. The law passed in February of that year authorized the registration of four "priests" two of whom must be members of the Mexican Schismatic Church.

At Aaraburo in the State of Guanajuato and in the Archdiocese of Mexico the traditional Feast of the Most Holy Sacrament was celebrated this month. The new Primate of Mexico, the Most Rev. Luis Martinez y Rodriguez, who was formerly Bishop Coadjutor of Mexico, presided at the ceremonies at the urgent request of the people.

The Chihuahua Legislature has repealed the law which limited the clergy in that State to one for the entire State. The new law allows one priest for every 100,000 inhabitants or fraction thereof in excess of 50,000. This will permit the registration of five priests.

The previous law had been held unconstitutional by the Federal Supreme Court in granting the injunction sought by three Juarez priests. It has been learned that before Father Uranga, one of these priests, was permitted to celebrate Mass at Juarez last Sunday, he had to telegraph the Supreme Court to notify the municipal president of its decision.

The local authorities tried to prevent the resumption of public worship in the Juarez churches on the ground that they had not been notified officially of the Supreme Court's decision. Even after the Supreme Court had telegraphed the municipal president, the latter refused to grant permission. Father Uranga then telephoned the Governor of Chihuahua, who ordered the resumption of religious services in Juarez.

The supreme Apostolic Office committed to us by the Sacred Prince of Pastors, for the government of the Universal Church, places on us the obligation of most diligently providing for all churches Bishops who will have the knowledge and ability to feed, guide and govern with salutary effect the flock of the Lord committed to their charge.

Therefore, since the Cathedral Church of Syracuse, suffragan of the Archdiocese of New York, is at present without a Bishop because of the transfer of our venerable Brother, John Duffy, to the Cathedral Church of Buffalo, with the advice of our venerable brothers, the Cardinals of the Holy Roman Church, we choose you by our apostolic authority for that See, and we place you over it as Bishop and Pastor.

We demand for you the care, direction and administration of the Diocese of Syracuse in all things spiritual and temporal, with all the rights and privileges, responsibilities and obligations belonging to this pastoral office.

Before you receive episcopal consecration and take canonical possession of the diocese assigned to you, we wish you to fulfill all the requirements of law and particularly we wish you to make the profession of faith and take the prescribed oath according to the established formulas before a Catholic Bishop of your choice who enjoys the favor and communion of the Holy See.

You are strictly held to send on immediately to the Sacred Consistorial Congregation these formulas bearing your signature and seal and the signature and seal of the aforesaid Bishop.

For your greater convenience, we grant you permission to be consecrated Bishop lawfully and freely outside the City of Rome by any Catholic Bishop with two other Catholic Bishops assisting him, providing that they enjoy the favor and communion of the Holy See.

By these letters we grant to our Venerable Brother whom you shall choose for this purpose the mandate and duty of consecrating you a Bishop. We strictly order you not to presume to be consecrated and the Bishop chosen by you not to consecrate you unless you have first made the profession of faith and taken the oath spoken of above, under the penalties prescribed by law if you disobey our command.

We have the firm hope and confidence the Diocese of Syracuse through your pastoral labors and fruitful zeal under the salutary assistance of the hand of God, will be governed to good effect and will show constant growth in spiritual and temporal blessings.

Given at Castel Gandolfo in the Year of Our Lord 1937, the 25th day of May, the sixteenth year of Our Pontificate. A. L.

**ESTABLISH PAPAL LEGATION FOR THE ETHIOPIAN STATE**

VATICAN CITY—The reorganization of the ecclesiastical area of Ethiopia has been gradually accomplished the last few months.

The Holy See considered this matter after the final conquest of that territory not only because Ethiopia is a large field open to missionary activity, but also because of a desire to give religious assistance to the large number of Italian colonists who, it is predicted, will settle in Italian East Africa.

The utmost caution had to be exercised for such an important work. The Holy See sent an Apostolic Visitor to Addis Ababa to see and report on the conditions of the country. He was Archbishop Giovanni Castellani, O.F.M., of Rhodes.

In the new arrangement the Apostolic Delegation of Ethiopia has been defined from the Apostolic Delegation of Egypt and has been made self-governing and independent, with residence in the capital, Addis Ababa. Archbishop Castellani has become Titular Archbishop of Perga and has been appointed Apostolic Delegate.

The jurisdiction of the whole territory has been divided, as before, between the Congregation of the Oriental Church and the Congregation of Propaganda. In general, it may be said that the Oriental Congregation controls the northern part of Ethiopia and the Congregation of Propaganda the southern.

**CITY PILGRIMS GET PAPAL AUDIENCE**

VATICAN CITY—Priests and lay pilgrims from the United States and Canada were among the more than 1,000 persons whom His Holiness Pope Pius XI received in audience at Castelgandolfo on Saturday.

The Very Rev. Peter Sontag, S.J., and the Rev. Paul Dent, S. J., American priests assigned to the Jesuit missions in India, were received at this audience. They were accompanied by the Very Rev. Vincent A. McCormick, S.J., an American priest who is Rector of the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. There were 16 pilgrims from the City of Chicago, and a smaller group from Rochester, N. Y.

The Holy Father addressed a few words to each group present at the audience, welcoming the pilgrims, and imparted his blessing.

**Friend on State Board**  
ALBANY, N. Y.—The Rev. Michael Francis Mulvey, C.S.S.P., pastor of St. Mark's Church, New York City, has been appointed by Gov. Herbert H. Lehman, one of a committee of three to investigate conditions and recommend measures to improve the economic, health, cultural and living conditions of the urban colored population of the State.

BALTIMORE—Mrs. Mary E. Quinn, mother of the Rev. J. Ambrose Quinn, Assistant Pastor of St. Bernard's Church here, and of Joseph J. Quinn, Managing Editor of The Southwest Courier, Oldham City, died here.

Mrs. Quinn was a native of County Mayo, Ireland, and came to this country when a young girl. Her husband, John Quinn, died some years ago. She is survived only by her two sons.

**FENTON RENAMED BY THE HIBERNIANS; COMMUNISM HIT**

ATLANTIC CITY, July 28.—John E. Fenton, of Lawrence, Mass., was re-elected President of the Ancient Order of Hibernians at the national convention here.

Other officers re-elected are: Thomas J. Finnegan, of Jersey City, National Vice-President; John J. Powell, of Montreal, Canadian Vice-President; Leo Kelley, of Pittsburgh, Secretary; William J. Ryan, of Lockport, N. Y., Treasurer; and Francis J. Dorman, of Baltimore, Charles J. Rooney, of Cleveland, Capt. Michael Blundell, of San Francisco, Michael M. Fee of Chicago and William Smithwick of New Haven, Conn., members of the Board of Directors.

At a solemn Mass in Our Lady of the Sea Church, the Most Rev. James A. Griffin, Bishop of Springfield in Illinois and National Chaplain of the A. O. H., declared that "Communism eventually leads to despotism more galling and degraded than the wildest anarchy." For proof, he said, "look at Russia."
