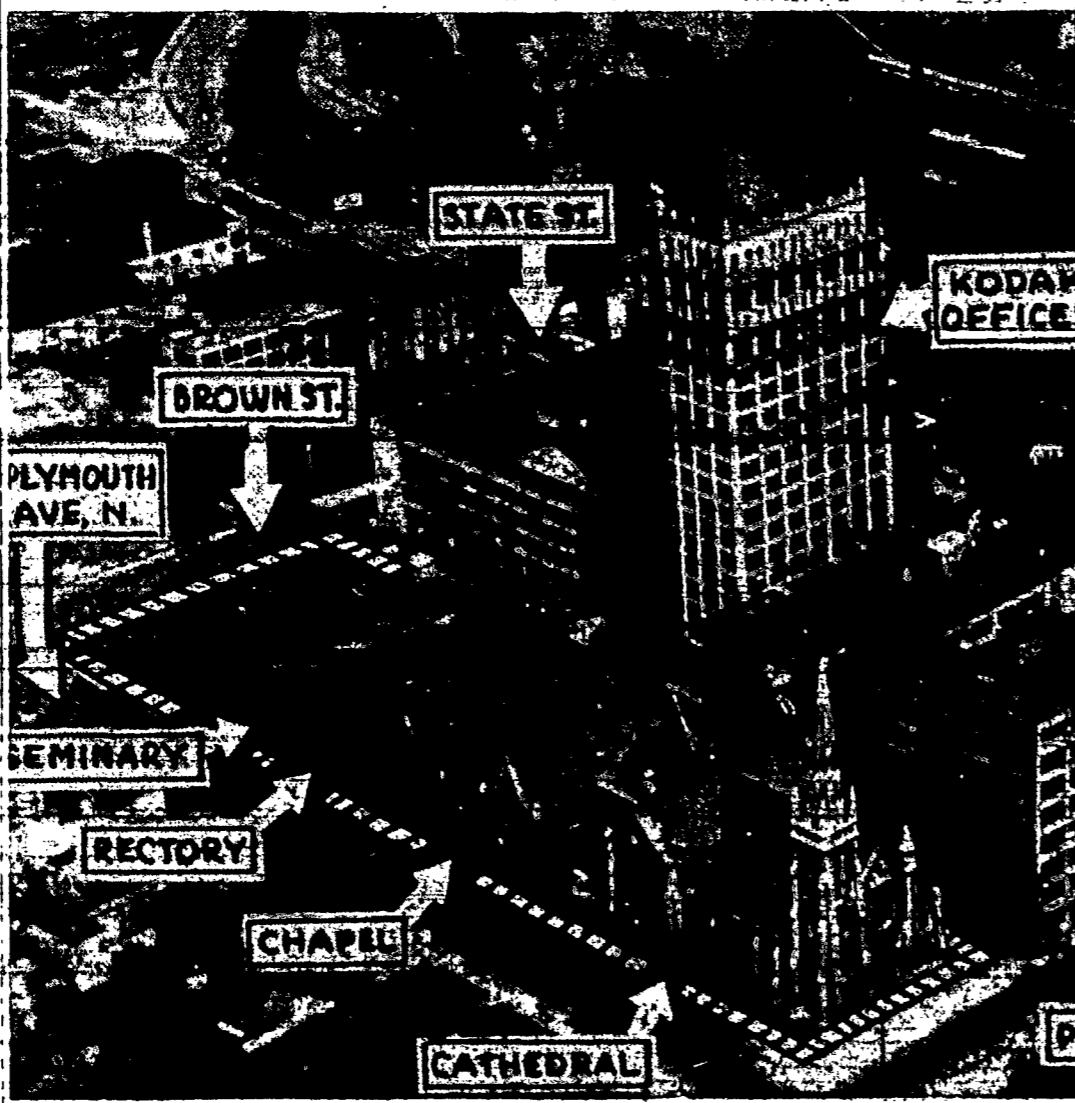

To Install Bp. Kearney October 28

Cardinal Hayes To Preside; Msgr. Hunt New Salt Lake Bishop

The Most Rev. James Edward Kearney will be installed as fifth Bishop of Rochester in St. Patrick's Cathedral on Thursday, October 28. His predecessor, Patrick Cardinal Hayes, will act as the installing prelate at the ceremony. The date selected by Bishop Kearney for his installation marks not only his fifty-third birthday but also the 100th anniversary of the consecration. Bishop Kearney was born in Rockport, Mass., on October 28, 1884, and was ordained to the priesthood in the City of Boston on August 2, 1907. He was appointed Bishop of Salt Lake City on August 2, 1937, by Cardinal Hayes.

DR. MCGUIRE PLANS TOUR OF SPAIN; DR. GEFELL TO SAIL

The Rev. Dr. Owen B. McGuire of Elmira, contributor to the CATHOLIC COURIER of special articles on Spain and widely recognized as one of the best informed writers on Spanish affairs, will sail for Spain on August 17, accompanied by the Rev. Dr. J. Emil Geffel, pastor of St. Peter and Paul's Church, Rochester, who will go to Rome. The two priests of the diocese will sail from New York on the S.S. Eschschoria of the American Transport Lines.

Bishop Kearney Must Select Sites For Pro-Cathedral, Seminary and Chanery If Kodak Deal Is Ratified

If the proposed sale of St. Patrick's Cathedral and other church property in Plymouth Avenue North to the Eastman Kodak Company is approved by the Holy See and Kodak directors, the Most Rev. James Edward Kearney, Bishop-elect of Rochester, must select a pro-cathedral and plot sites for a new St. Andrew's Seminary and a Chanery Office.

All three steps are entirely contingent on the consummation of the pending deal announced by Frank W. Lovejoy, Kodak president. In a brief statement issued several days ago, Mr. Lovejoy said: "Eastman Kodak Company has acquired what is equivalent to an option to purchase the Catholic Cathedral and plot sites for a new St. Andrew's Seminary and Chanery property located on the east side of Plymouth Avenue North."

The sale will be effected only if approved by the Holy See and by the directors of Eastman Kodak Company on or before September 13, 1937. If not so approved, the agreement will become void. It is not at liberty at the present time to disclose the option price. Problem Awaits Bishop. If the deal goes through not a single step toward the selection of new sites will be taken by the Rochester Diocese until Bishop Kearney is installed and studies the problem at length.

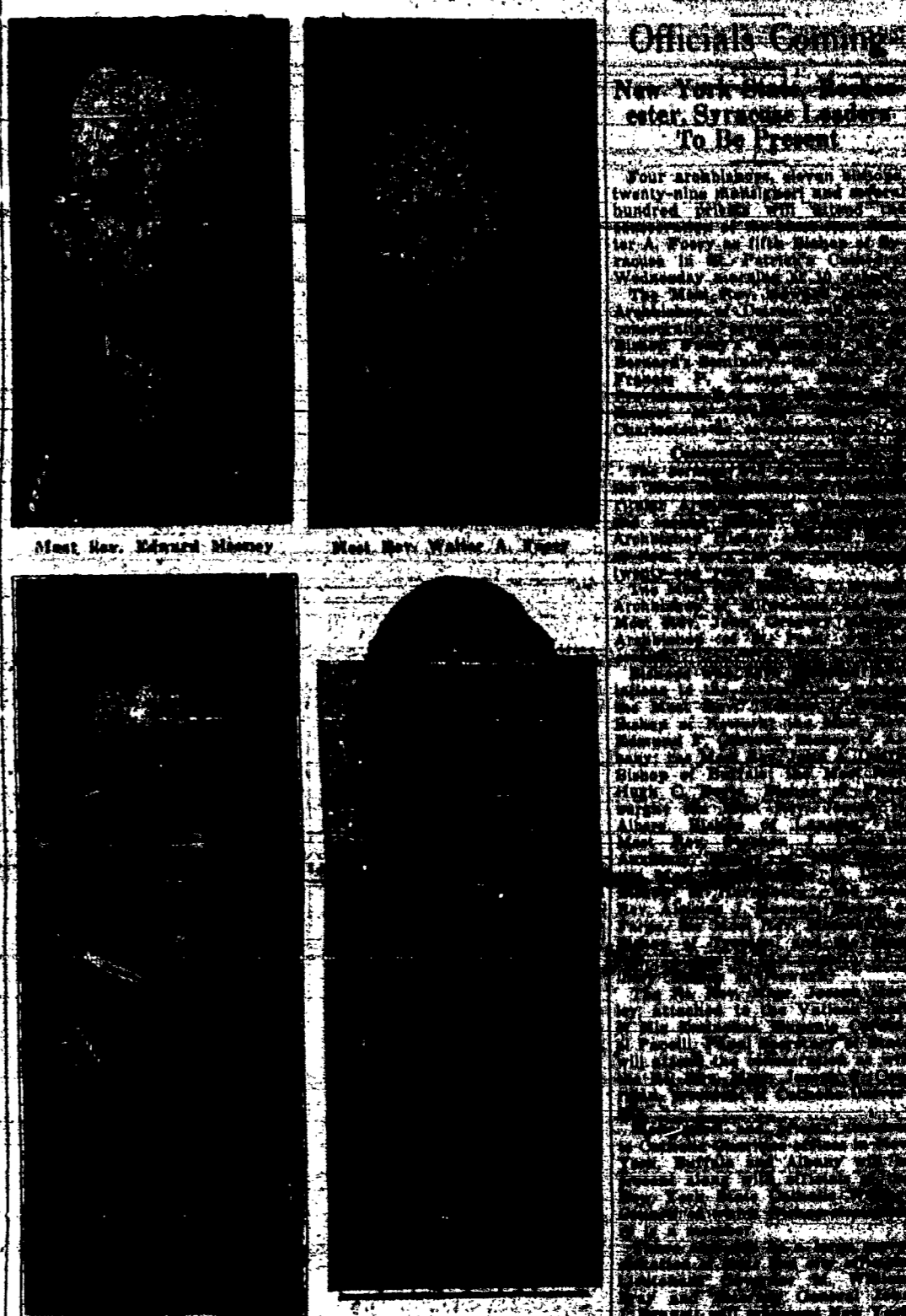
Syracuse Girl Reports Self Cured At St. Anne's

FOES OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION WARNED BY HOLY FATHER

VATICAN CITY—Calling Christian education "one of the best gifts God can give after Baptism," His Holiness Pope Pius XI on Saturday warned that a disregard for this instruction is incalculable for any nation which neglects Christian instruction, and the more so for any nation wherein such instruction is opposed and fought.

The Holy Father was speaking to a group of 200 Belgian Catholic teachers, who were among the 1,500 persons received in a general audience at Castelgandolfo. Also received at this audience were a group of pilgrims from Boston, organized by the Catholic Church Extension and headed by the Most Rev. Daniel F. Desmond, Bishop of Alexandria, La. The Most Rev. Francis J. Spellman, Auxiliary Bishop of Boston, also was present at the audience.
