Bishop-elect Foery then was escorted to his consecration for the preliminary examination.

As senior co-consecrator, Bishop Walsh then turned to Archbishop Mooney with this request:

"Most Reverend Father, our Holy Mother the Catholic Church asks that you promote this priest here present to the burden of the episcopate."

To which Archbishop Mooney asked:

"Have you the Apostolic mandate?"

With a reply in the affirmative from Bishop Walsh, Archbishop Mooney ordered it to be read.

**Papal Bull Read**  
The Rt. Rev. Magr. William M. Bergan, Chancellor of the Diocese, then mounted the pulpit and read the Papal Bull containing the appointment of Bishop-elect Foery to rule over the See of Syracuse.

In clear voice, Bishop-elect Foery then read aloud his oath of allegiance to the Holy See, touching the book of the Gospels held by Archbishop Mooney. He concluded with these words:

"I help the God and these Holy Gospels of God."

The preliminary examination of Bishop-elect Foery followed with Archbishop Mooney putting the questions to him aloud while the co-consecrators, Bishops Walsh and Keough, carried on the interrogation in a lower voice.

To each individual question concerning his future conduct as Bishop-elect, Bishop-elect Foery slightly and answered:

"I will."

Questions Asked.  
He was asked if he will make his conduct accord with the teachings of Scripture, if he will keep and reverently teach the traditions of the Orthodox Fathers and the decrees of the Holy See, if he will exhibit in all things fidelity submission, obedience to His Holiness the Pope and to the Vicar of Christ, Pope Pius XI and to his successors, the Roman Pontiffs, if he will avoid evil and practice good, observe and teach chastity and sobriety, abstain from worldly affairs and be devoted to the things of God, be humble, patient and merciful.

The examination ended, Bishop-elect Foery kissed the hand of Archbishop Mooney and then both started the Mass with the co-consecrators by saying the opening prayer at the foot of the altar.

**Bishop-Elect's Altar**  
Archbishop Mooney ascended the main altar at the conclusion of the prayers but Bishop-elect Foery was led to his altar at the right where he took off his cope, put on the stole in the style of a Bishop, the pastoral cross and chasuble.

He then proceeded with the Mass until the end of the Gradual as directed by Archbishop Mooney.

At the structure, Bishop-elect Foery, accompanied by Bishops Walsh and Keough went to the main altar and seated himself in front of Archbishop Mooney who sat on the tabernacle facing the people.

While the choir chanted the Litany of the Saints, the Archbishop, Bishop-elect and co-consecrators prostrated themselves in prayer.

Archbishop Mooney, facing Bishop-elect Foery, chanted the petitions that had special reference to him.

Aided by the co-consecrators, Archbishop Mooney at the conclusion of the Litany touched the neck and shoulders of Bishop-elect Foery with the open book of the Gospels.

The imposition of hands followed with the Archbishop and Bishops Walsh and Keough touching both hands and head of Bishop-elect Foery and saying "Receive the Holy Ghost."

Following the solemn anointing

The Bishop-elect at the altar was assisted by Archbishop Mooney who imparted the blessing, sprinkled him with holy water and then handed to him Bishop-elect Foery the book of the Gospels.

The Mass of the day followed with Archbishop Mooney playing the organ and the choir singing the Mass. Bishop-elect Foery, on his return to the altar gave his pastoral blessing.

Assistant priest at the Mass was the Rt. Rev. Magr. William M. Bergan, Administrator of the House of the Holy Spirit, John Hoppert and James McLea were as assistant deacons with the Rt. Rev. Magr. Joseph B. Carmichael as deacon of the Mass and the Rt. Rev. Magr. Charles F. Shay as subdeacon.

The Rt. Rev. Magr. J. F. Goggin was master of ceremonies with Monsignor Bergan as assistant master. The Rt. Rev. Magr. Joseph B. Carmichael was master of ceremonies to Bishop-elect Foery.

General servers at the ceremony were the Rev. Edward Lyons, the Rev. Gerald Lambert, the Rev. Lawrence Casey and the Rev. Herbert Rully. The Rev. Arthur P. Florack and the Rev. Edward T. Gerald Brennan and William Stauder, chaplains to Bishop Keough.

The Rev. Joseph Carmichael was cross bearer and the Rev. John M. Duffy, minister to Bishop-elect Foery. The Rev. William Brown and the Rev. John Smith were acolytes and the Rev. Joseph McDonnell book bearer.

The Rev. John Wheaton was candle bearer, the Rev. William Hassel, organ bearer, the Rev. Leo Smith, mitre bearer, the Rev. William Naughton, censer bearer, and the Rev. Charles Brunton, gremial bearer.

### SPANISH CARDINAL, NOTED ARCHBISHOP OF SEVILLE, DIES

SEVILLE. His Eminence Eugenio Cardinal Huidobro y Estaban, Archbishop of Seville, died at the age of 74. Death was due to bronchial pneumonia.

Last month His Eminence escaped death in an auto mishap near the town of Bujalano when the car in which he was riding with his secretary struck a tree.

His Eminence was born on September 21, 1862 in Pamplona and was ordained in his early twenties.

He was named Bishop of Orense in 1914 and Archbishop of Seville in 1920. Five years later he was elevated to the Sacred College.

At the beginning of the civil war in Spain the Cardinal was a prisoner in his residence as the Left and Rightist forces waged a bitter struggle in the streets of Seville. When General Queipo de Llano secured control of the city, the Cardinal devoted himself without stint to the restoration of churches and care of the wounded.

Cardinal Huidobro served as Papal Legate to the Spanish-American Marian Congress here in 1929.
