ST. PAUL, MINN.—Speaking for the man in the street, in his presidential address to the twenty-third annual meeting of the National Conference of Catholic Charities here this week, James Fitzgerald, Executive Secretary of the St. Vincent de Paul Society, Detroit, Mich., said there are three simple ideas that must be heeded in the present social confusion.

The ideas he cited are: "There is God. There is property. There is common sense." "Without God, you have no order, without property you have no freedom, without common sense you have no charity in the world."

Text of Bishop Foery's Address

SYRACUSE—Here is the complete text of the address delivered by the Most Rev. Walter A. Foery Wednesday, on the occasion of his installation as Fifth Bishop of the Syracuse Diocese in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception:

Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, do manfully and be strengthened. Let all your things be done in charity.

It is true to say that we live in a changing world. In fact, history gives evidence that the world is not static but fluid. It is man with his school of thought—with his great world movements—with the intellectual and physical impact which makes upon his fellow man, and his environment that moves the world in constant change.

As we survey these changes we observe in them the power of man—the skill of his hand, the genius of his intellect. He has drawn from nature, some of nature's secrets. He has conquered the sea. He has conquered the air.

Changeless Needs. It would appear that man had changed himself. With his scientific progress, his material pride in his own achievements, man forgot that in the changing world his own heart remains unchanged. It is true that some of his needs are conditioned by his environment but basically and fundamentally the needs of the human heart are as changeless as God Himself.

Everything that he does, every dream that flashes through his mind, is under this influence. This is a universal law. Man could not, if he would do otherwise, than seek his own happiness in his search for it he has frequently been deceived. This deception has been the result of his own folly or improper guidance.

When God is revealed to him that he was made for eternity for happiness. The way of life was pointed out, the truth of the life of grace was revealed to his soul. These three gifts of the Creator established for man the proper relationship between himself and his Creator.

God did not forsake him. From that time through prophet and otherwise, He visited him, to make known the way lost by sin and faulty teaching, to stress again the truth obscured with the passage of time, to give man back the relationship which had been lost.

Dean of Cardinal Deacons Succumbs To Pneumonia

VATICAN CITY—Cardinal Gaetano Bisleti, prefect of the Congregation of Bishops and of the University of Studies and Dean of the cardinal deacons, died Monday at Grotta Ferrata, a small town about twenty miles from Rome where he was vacationing.

The Cardinal contracted bronchial pneumonia just weeks ago. He was created a Cardinal in 1911 on his return from Vienna where he officiated at the marriage of the late Emperor Karl of Austria and the former Empress Zita.

Cardinal Bisleti was a member of the Order of Malta, had many American connections and was the protector of various religious orders. He was born in Veroli, Province of Rome, on March 22, 1855.

Again we find Him on the shores, after turning the Peter He fulfill the promise that He had made—"Feed my lambs, feed my sheep." The figure of speech used by Our Divine Saviour on this occasion had but one meaning. It is conjoined upon Simon the supreme pastorate of the Church.
