Bare Basque Propaganda In Britain

Claim To Have Forced Government's Hand on Evaluation of Children

Children as Propaganda

"The importance of this propaganda is sufficient to say, however, that before this stratagem was not the faintest indication of the British Government wanting to interfere in any way."

"The consequence was that in the radio news on the arrival of the children the only person individually named and who also spoke was Mrs. Manning, who had been in Bilbao, and Senor Lizaso as representative of the Basque Government, thus assisting a fresh official recognition of Basque independence by the B.C.C., which is State-controlled."

Rockbottom Dogma Seen For Classes

Fr. Le Buffle Gives His Views At Teachers' Institute

A plea to teach parochial school children "rock-bottom" dogmas in classes in religion was made by the Rev. Francis P. LeBuffle, S.J., in an address at the thirty-third annual conference of diocesan teachers at Aquinas Institute last Friday.

Some 700 priests, nuns and lay teachers attended the various sessions of the Institute. Father Le Buffle spoke under the general subject of "How To Teach the Abstract." During his address, illustrations he showed the teachers how some of the dogmas of the Catholic Faith can be presented in a fashion easy enough for the average grammar school pupil to comprehend.

SPANISH PRIMATE THANKS CATHOLICS OF U.S. FOR AID

NEW YORK Upon the receipt of the first check for \$1000 sent to His Eminence Idro Cardinal Goma y Tomas, Primate of Spain, for the immediate relief of the children of Bilbao and the Basque lands, His Eminence thanked the Chairman of the Relief Fund, the Rev. Francis M. Talbot, S.J., Editor of America, and the contributors. Cardinal Goma wrote:

"I have read with much emotion your two letters of June 29 and July 1. In one of them was enclosed a check for \$1,000, a gift of the North American Catholics for the children of Bilbao and the Basque Province. May our Divine Lord reward them for this charity, and repay them with all His abundant generosity. They can be sure that this sum will be expended for the benefit of those for whom the funds have been destined."

"Thanking you with all my heart for the appreciation of my sympathy which you show for our beloved and much tried country, may you receive the blessing which, from all my heart, I wish in the name of all those benefited by your charity. I am sending you before this letter was received, the Fund was enabled through the generosity of its friends to make a second donation of \$1,000 for the specified purpose of feeding and clothing children of the Northern Province of Spain. This week Father Talbot announced that an additional gift of \$2,000 was being sent for relief work among the children of Santander and the Asturias."

Serious Newspaper Error Corrected

An erroneous newspaper headline last Saturday morning stated that the Rev. Charles J. Mahoney, associate superintendent of diocesan schools, had issued the following statement: "The Teachers' Institute that morning prayers would be dropped in our Catholic Schools in favor of periods of reflection."

Nothing could have been further from the truth. To correct any misconceptions which that unfortunate error has given rise among our Catholic people, Father Mahoney has issued the following statement: "Any impression that the schools of the diocese will drop morning prayers in favor of two minute reflection periods is entirely erroneous."

"We always have had morning prayers in our schools and there is no intention whatsoever to discontinue that practice. It has been decided to have a moment or two of reflection each evening preceding the prayers to put our children in the proper frame of mind so that the prayers may be said more attentively."
