This announcement was made this week by J. L. O'Sullivan, Dean of Marquette University College of Journalism and National Director of the Catholic School Press Association.

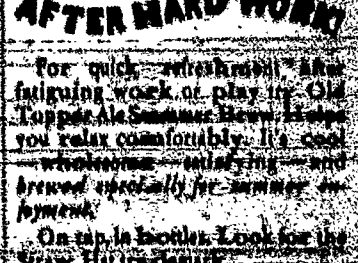

New Mission Opened in Albania
 Few Americans know anything about Albania. It is a small country of Greece. It has a population of about a million people of whom more than eight hundred and fifty thousand are Mohammedans. The Christians belong mostly to the Greek Orthodox Church. Less than fifteen thousand are Catholics.

Father Francis Brunetti, the Superior of the Catholic Mission writes: "We are beginning to see light. Much of the opposition is passing and many of the Orthodox Christians are friendly. Recently we opened a mission in Korca, which is a large center. The population is largely Catholic but not Catholic. In two months we have received into the Church fifty-three people. We are delighted and we believe this number will increase. People are intelligent, but they lack religious instruction. They are interested and come to our classes. I think that Korca offers us a splendid opportunity. We have rented a large house for one hundred and fifty dollars a year. We need an altar and articles for that altar. One hundred and five dollars will cover everything. To keep going and to live frugally, two missionaries need between them fifteen dollars a month. Please do not throw up your hands. I am asking only for the barest necessities. So, here is what Father needs: \$150.00 for his house and chapel; \$180.00 to furnish the chapel; \$180.00 to support two priests for a year.

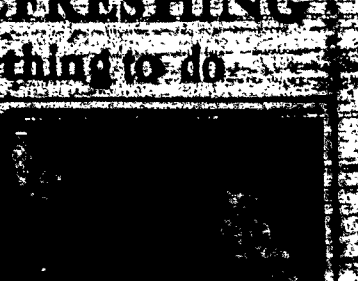
