

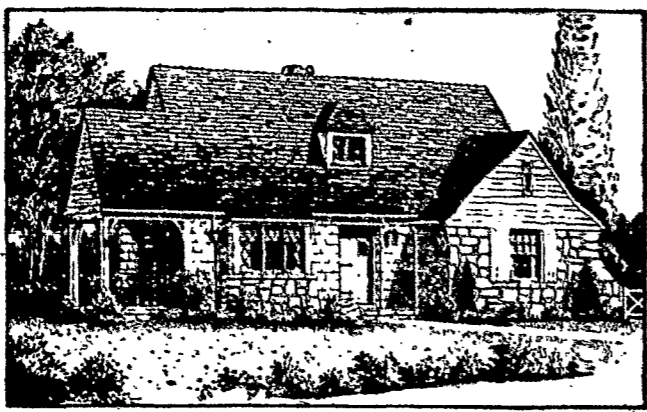

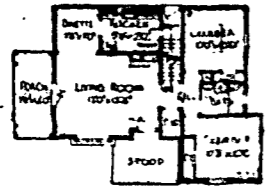


Small House Has Unusual Features for Its Low Cost

Many homebuilders turn instinctively to a house that reflects the English influence for the quietness that many people seek in a home of their own are almost always found in an English design. In this particular small house the English exterior has been successfully combined with all the conveniences of a present-day American home.

A paved terrace leads directly to the front entrance opening into the living room. Grouped windows, French doors leading to an open porch and a wide opening into the adjoining dining make this room light and airy, and adequate wall space for furniture, built-in book shelves and a convenient closet near enough to the front door to serve as a coat closet for guests.

The small dining room, almost square in shape for convenient arrangement, is separated from the living room by only a cased opening.



An arrangement that adds materially to the spacious feeling achieved in this small house is Cross Ventilation.

The kitchen is small and planned for utmost convenience. Sink, work tables and cabinets are arranged and refrigerator in the rear opposite wall provides space for a sink and refrigerator. The rear entry, a step below the level of the kitchen provides a grade entrance to the basement, equally accessible to the kitchen and outside doors.

A cased opening at one end of the living room separates the bedroom hall from the rest of the house. This space is returned to a minimum hall at the other end. The porch at the end of the house opens into the bedroom and bath, and two closets. Closet space throughout the house is generously provided. The coat closet, mentioned before, a linen closet, and large closets of each of the bedrooms provide adequate storage space.

Each of the bedrooms have cross ventilation and both are well provided with wall space for all necessary pieces of furniture.

The porch at the end of the house could if desired be enclosed to form a desirable sun porch, and the attic with stairs convenient to the first floor bath may be finished to provide extra bedrooms at some later date.

A modern heating plant, laundry room and other items of millwork are provided in the basement and an attractive recreation room might be finished here.

As shown here, the house is finished in a simple, dignified manner. The use of a neutral color scheme for the walls and trim, and the use of a few pieces of original English patterned wallpaper are all suitable. Children Get Free Text Books

Louisiana Makes Provisions For Parochial Pupils

BATON ROUGE, La.—Most parochial schools of Louisiana began the fall term with their libraries enlarged through an act of the 1936 Legislature which provided that library books be furnished to the school children of the State through the State Board of Education and paid for out of the Severance Tax Fund.

The act provides also that other such books as paper pens, pens and ink also be furnished to the school children.

Distribution of the 200,000 volumes bought last year at a cost of approximately \$200,000 has not been completed. No distribution with regard to public, parochial and private schools, the act specifying that library books and school supplies be furnished at public expense to the school children of the State.

Libraries Replenished
The second purchase of books, about a year hence, is expected to amount to \$300,000. The distribution was somewhat delayed because of the need of the library. All elementary school libraries in the State were brought up to the minimum State standard of one volume per pupil.

All high school libraries were brought up to the standard unless an excessive number of books was needed. If the high school library was far below standard the distribution was made on the basis of enrollment.

A high school library was penalized if its librarian was not a qualified librarian or if he or she was not allowed to spend the required number of hours in the library.

The maximum State provision of books for schools meeting requirements is on the following enrollment basis: Up to 174 children, two volumes per pupil; 175 to 249 enrollment, 1 1/2 volumes per pupil; 250 to 399 enrollment, 1 volume per pupil; 400 to 599 enrollment, 1/2 volume per pupil; 600 to 799 enrollment, 1/3 volume per pupil; 800 to 1,199 enrollment, 1/4 volume per pupil; 1,200 to 2,599 enrollment, 1/5 volume per pupil; 2,600 to 5,000 enrollment, 1/6 volume per pupil.

Distribution next year will be on the following enrollment basis: Up to 174 children, 1 1/2 volumes per pupil; 175 to 249 enrollment, 1 volume per pupil; 250 to 399 enrollment, 1/2 volume per pupil; 400 to 599 enrollment, 1/3 volume per pupil; 600 to 799 enrollment, 1/4 volume per pupil; 800 to 1,199 enrollment, 1/5 volume per pupil; 1,200 to 2,599 enrollment, 1/6 volume per pupil; 2,600 to 5,000 enrollment, 1/7 volume per pupil.

The act also provides that the State Board of Education shall be authorized to purchase and distribute to the parochial and private school children of Louisiana.

Issuing Security Numbers at Counter

To meet the requirement of employers who have announced a policy of insuring that prospective employees have their Social Security account numbers before they are hired, and to avoid loss of a job to someone who has no account number, the Rochester Office of the Board located at 5 Broad Street, is issuing counter service to those whose immediate need of an account number is imperative.

An account number can be issued in from 10 to 15 minutes to anyone applying in person for this service. The procedure consists of making application on form SS-5, which, if one is procured from an employer, or Post Office, may be done before the applicant goes to the office. After this form has been examined for correctness of detail it is sent to a typist who transfers the data to Form CA-102.

Part of the original of this form goes to the Bureau of Maryland where the entire Social Security records for the nation are kept. The other part of the original is the Social Security Account Number Card which is given to the applicant. After thirty days the duplicates of these forms are forwarded to Albany, N. Y., where they are used as enumeration records in connection with Unemployment Compensation Insurance.

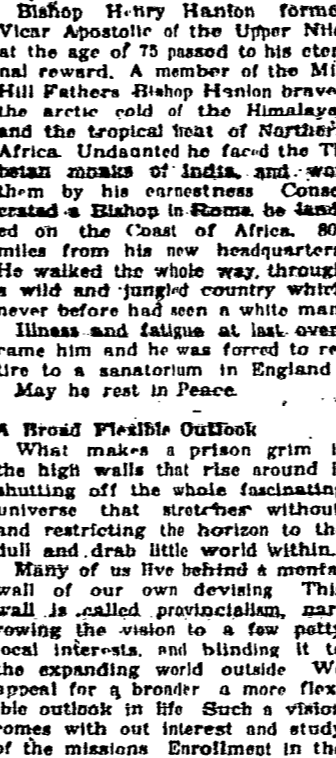
