"The Beacon Bulletin," a bi-weekly Catholic newspaper, edited and printed by inmates of Elmira Reformatory, made its first appearance.

The Rev. Leo G. Schwab was named as the first pastor of a new parish named in honor of Our Lady of Lourdes, which the Most Rev. James E. Kearney established in West Elmira.

The Rev. Robert I. Cannon, S. J., Ph.D., president of Fordham University, delivered the Commencement address at Nazareth College from which a class of 53 was graduated.

The Most Rev. James E. Kearney announced an immediate building plan for Nazareth College and said ground would be broken July 5 for the first unit.

Blessing of the new wing of Nazareth Academy in Lake Avenue, built at a cost of \$155,000, took place June 9, with the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester, in charge of the ceremony.

The Rev. Patrick Kelly, pastor of St. Catherine's Church, Addison, celebrated his Silver Sacramental Jubilee, Sunday, June 16, with Solemn High Mass, assisted by the Rev. Joseph Kennedy as deacon and the Rev. Arthur LeMay as sub-deacon. The Rev. Joseph E. Guilford, preached the jubilee sermon.

The Rev. Donald B. O'Rourke, pastor of Mother of Sorrows Church, was presented with an agnomite by parishioners in recognition of his services as he completed 26 years in the priesthood. President Roosevelt, Senator Mead, Congressman O'Brien, Bishop Kearney, and many other noted men sent him congratulatory messages.

The Rev. Joseph A. Carmona, pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, turned the first shovelful of earth for the Assisi Recreation Hall for underaged boys in the parish.

The Rev. Joseph A. Baberak, pastor of St. Stanislaus Church, celebrated his Sacramental Silver Jubilee with a Solemn High Mass in the church Sunday, June 16. He was assisted by two nephews from the Franciscan Order, the Rev. Victor Baberak, as deacon, and the Rev. Joseph Capla as sub-deacon.

Joseph P. Flynn began his second term as Grand Knight of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus.

Wholehearted response from pastors, priests and parishioners came in the campaign instituted

by Bishop Kearney for decent literature and to clean up the newsstands. With thousands taking pledges at the National Organization for Decent Literature, with the "enthusiasm of cooperation from stores and stands selling magazines, the campaign proceeded.

The Rev. Bernard Lefrois, S. V. D., of Rochester; the Rev. John Maney, formerly of Geneva, and Joseph Egan, Horseheads, a student at the North American College in Rome, were among 450 American priests, seminarians and nuns who returned to America as Italy entered the European war.

The Congregation of Sisters of St. Joseph in the Rochester Diocese branched out into the mission field for the first time with the announcement that four nuns would be sent to Selma, Alabama, to take up their work in the negro mission of St. Elizabeth's.

In an impressive ceremony at Dunn Memorial Chapel, Elmira, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester, invested 117 Elmira Ladies of Charity members in the full affiliation in the diocese.

At the 60th annual commencement exercises of St. Andrew's Seminary, 16 graduates were administered by Bishop Kearney to hold fast to the ideals instilled during seminary years.

The Rev. John M. Ball, pastor of St. Rose's Church, Lima, celebrated his Sacramental Silver Jubilee with Solemn High Mass Sunday, June 16. He was assisted by his brother, the Rev. Edward K. Ball as deacon and the Rev. Emmett Magee as sub-deacon.

Fortified with good Catholic training, 617 boys and girls graduated from Catholic High Schools of the Diocese of Rochester. The Most Rev. James E. Kearney presided at each of the exercises. In a letter to parents, he said they have had a deeply religious atmosphere during the years in school and need to be in the same atmosphere if they go to college.

The Rev. William A. Doran, pastor of St. Anne's Church, Palmyra, celebrated his Silver Sacramental Jubilee, celebrating Solemn High Mass Sunday, June 16. A number of priests were present for the occasion.

The Rev. John E. Maney, former Genevan, celebrated his first Solemn High Mass in St. Stanislaus Church, Geneva.

George X. Hietler, 81, a pioneer in the foundry industry and father of Herman G. Hietler, widely known for his work in marking Catholic historical places, died June 21.

An estimated 9,000 delegates and visitors attended the 43rd International Convention of the Knights of St. John and the 22nd International Convention of the Ladies Auxiliary, Knights of St. John, with headquarters in Hotel Seneca.

The Rev. Adelbert Salerno, O.F.M., Cap., formerly of Rochester, who was ordained to the priesthood at Mount St. Alphonsus, Esopus, N. Y., celebrated his first Solemn High Mass at St. Anthony's Church, this city.

July 19, 1940. The Most Rev. James E. Kearney celebrated the Solemn Votive Mass of the Immaculate Conception at the Holy Sepulchre of the

Sacred Heart, July 4 "for the peace and preservation of the United States." Catholics throughout the diocese had been called for prayer on this day.

Ground was broken by the Most Rev. James E. Kearney for a new Nazareth College to be built on the grounds west of the Sisters of St. Joseph Motherhouse, Pittsford, July 5. This ceremony followed ceremonies of reception and profession of 17 novices who pronounced Perpetual Vows.

The Rev. William J. Sheehan, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, in Binghamton, who was a graduate of St. Bernard's Seminary, died in that city.

Children of St. Patrick's and St. Mary's Home and those who were housed in the former St. Joseph's Orphan Asylum, will go into new, modern cottage-type homes in June, 1941, the Chancery announced. They are to be built on the diocesan-owned Clark farm in Dewey Avenue.

Alban J. Linnenbach, well known Catholic layman, died at his home at 77 Nelson Street, Auburn.

Restoration of world peace was the intention of a Novena at St. Ann's Church, Hornell, with the Rev. Peter Starin, C.S.S.R., preaching at the service.

March 20, 1941. Michael F. Larkin of Rome asked 100 Knights of Columbus delegates to the Central New York Chapter meeting at Auburn, to oppose the forces of "No God, No Christ" with strong, unified effort.

Mrs. Antonio Gonzalez, a member of the State Commission of Correction, was guest of honor at a tea given by the Elmira Ladies of Charity at the Elmira Country Club.

The Rev. John S. Randall, the cesan director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, appealed for gifts to furnish the Mission Home which the Sisters of St. Joseph were to establish in Alaska.

Nineteen per cent of magazine dealers signified their intention to cooperate in the Bishop's Campaign for Decent Literature at the diocese.

Sister M. Teresa Hayes, teacher of English in Nazareth Academy for more than 20 years, died at the Nazareth Motherhouse in Pittsford July 19.

Bernard E. Finnegan, prominent Catholic layman, was made president of the Security Trust Company.

ANNUAL CARE COST

(Required on all lots purchased before April 1, 1925)

Lots purchased before above date were listed at a price that made no provision for continued care but only for the value of the land. Owing to the growth of Holy Sepulchre and the rapidly increasing cost of maintaining grounds in proper condition, it has become necessary to charge lot owners at their heirs for the ordinary care of above described lots.

Under a recent regulation passed by the Cemetery, individual lots are subject to an annual fee for cutting and trimming grass on same. Charge for this labor varies according to size of lots:

- 2 and 4 grave lots, \$1.00 per season. 6 and 7 grave lots, 1.50 per season. 12 and 14 grave lots, 3.00 per season.

Two Sisters of Notre Dame marked their golden jubilee in the order at Holy Family Church Saturday, July 26. They are Sister M. Lorraine, who was at Sacred Heart School, Baltimore, 49 years, and Sister M. Charles of Holy Family School, Rochester, where she has been 38 years. The Rev. Joseph H. Garret celebrated Solemn High Mass.

The Rev. John M. Duffy, Superintendent of Catholic Schools in the Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Rochester, indicated that about 26,000 pupils would enter the elementary and secondary schools of the diocese—a part of the 2,086,071 total to be enrolled throughout the United States. Fundamental Christian teachings as offered in Catholic schools, constitute the basis of world peace, it was said.

The date for the fourth public ceremony for Blessing of Expectant Mothers was set for Sept. 12 in the Chapel of St. Joseph's Church, Rochester.

A \$250,000 goal for the Nazareth College campaign was set by the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester, with an announcement that the campaign would be started October 21.

The Reverend Mother Rose Marian announced that these Sisters of St. Joseph had been selected for the mission for colored people at Selma, Alabama. Sister Frances Marie Krough, Sister Catherine Charlotte Hyland, Sister Mary Anastasia McCormack, Sister Francis De Sales Murphy and Sister Mary Ellen Dundy.

Five thousand children from pre-school to the high school completed their courses in 58 Religious Vacation Schools in the diocese.

First spiritual retreat of Ladies of Charity of Elmira began August 13 at St. Charles Church, Elmira Heights, with the Rev. Thomas J. Coffey, S.J., of the Loyola House of Retreats, Morristown, N. J., as Retreat Master.

A beautiful American flag was presented by the Knights of Equity to Camp Stella Maria, with Sir Knight Walter Simpson making the presentation.

A Novena of Peace was opened at Cliff Haven Summer School.

Nazareth Alumnae arranged for four concerts instead of three to be given under its auspices by the Rochester Summer Symphony Orchestra at Highland Park.

The Rev. Robert M. Fischette, 1529 Clifford Avenue, and the Rev. Leo G. Alem, 3716 St. Paul Boulevard, newly ordained Basilian priests, returned to their home parishes to say first Masses.

The Rev. James W. Fischer, 59-year-old pastor of St. Patrick's Church, at Moravia, died unexpectedly Tuesday, August 27, at Quebec, Canada, where he had gone for a fishing trip.

Our Lady of Lourdes, new West Elmira church, instituted campaign to raise \$10,000.

To sanctify this holiday dedicated to the working man, the Votive Mass of St. Joseph, the Carpenter, was offered by the Most Rev. James E. Kearney in special observance of Labor Day at the Holy Cathedral, at the Sacred Heart.

Cyril J. Stutz was appointed Master of the Fifth District, Fourth Degree, Knights of Columbus.

Miss Laura K. Schilling of Rochester was named President of the New York State Branch, National Catholic Women's Union.

St. Francis de Sales school building at Geneva, completed, remodeled after a disastrous fire in February, was inspected by a large number of visitors.

Miss Jane M. Flannigan, assistant secretary of Geneva Chamber of Commerce, resigned to become a member of the faculty of Nazareth College.

Sister M. Vincent Derriffe died September 4 at the Mother House of the Sisters of St. Joseph, Pittsford.

The Rt. Rev. Magr. J. F. Goggin, rector of St. Bernard's Seminary, consecrated a beautiful new liturgical altar in the Major Seminary Chapel.

Ten thousand persons who went to Holy Sepulchre Cemetery for the solemn ceremony of Blessing the Graves, were told by the Most Rev. James E. Kearney that they could find consolation in prayers to Our Lady of Sorrows.

With solemn ceremonies of farewell, five Sisters of St. Joseph left the Mother House at Pittsford to take up mission work among the negroes of the South.

With 1,000 parishioners in attendance, Bishop Kearney opened the Novena to Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal in Corpus Christi Church.

Raymond A. Kelly was elected president of SS. Peter and Paul's Parish Credit Union, the fifth credit union in the city.

The Rt. Rev. William M. Hart, Vicar General of the diocese, officiated at the laying of the cornerstone of the St. Francis of Assisi Recreation Hall.

Observance of the Feast of Christian Doctrine Oct. 27 focused attention of the importance of catechetical teaching.
