PROTECT FRENCH ROUTE

To protect the trade route which went by way of Irondequoit and Fort Niagara and Lake Erie to the Ohio, the French built Fort Presque Isle near-site of the modern Barcelona on the south shore of Lake Erie at the beginning of the portage to French Creek.

On his map a portage is shown between the Chautauque Lake and the Allegheny River which flows by modern Pittsburgh.
