Holy Father Approves Fr. Coughlin Corrections

pression of my own deep regret that in editing this statement Father Coughlin did not have the prudent counsel of a friendly critic which it is the aim of Church legislation to provide. I am confident that he would thus have been kept from using, even unwittingly, an analogy which might leave with the ordinary reader the impression that there is a basic opposition in principle between the Catholic Church and the C. I. O., just as there is, for instance, between Catholicity and Mohammedanism, Catholicity and Communism, or Catholicity and Islamism.

The clearly stated fundamental principles of both Catholicity and Communism are incompatible on the same basis. But no Catholic Church authority has ever asserted that the C. I. O. is incompatible with Catholicity on the basis of its publicly stated principles though it is undoubtedly true that there are Communists in the C. I. O. who are making every endeavor to gain control of the organization for communistic purposes, and it is the conscientious duty of Catholics in the C. I. O. to resist these efforts.

The same prudent counsel would also have kept Father Coughlin from using the unfortunate words "personal stupidity" to describe a recent official action of the President of the United States. It is the duty of every citizen to disagree with the President and they may feel the duty of publicly expressing such disagreement, especially in matters of high moral import. But a deeply considered respect for authority as well as a consciousness of the reverence with which their own sacred calling is regarded always makes them, on reflection, impose upon themselves a sane sense of restraint in the language they use.

On October 2, Father Coughlin made a statement saying that he had presented to the Archbishop a proposed reply to the latter's statement, and that this proposed reply had not received approval. Father Coughlin then announced he had cancelled contracts previously made for a series of radio broadcasts.

Archbishop Mooney thereupon stated specifically: "Father Coughlin expressed determination to cancel his broadcasting contracts, represents an entirely independent position on his part. Father Coughlin never even mentioned to me any thought of cancelling his broadcasts." The Archbishop added that he had advised Father Coughlin against publishing his proposed reply because the latter had gone beyond the two specific points which the Archbishop earlier had raised.

CARDINAL-ELECT HAILED IN LONDON

LONDON (CNCable)—The Most Rev. Arthur Hinsley, Archbishop of Westminster, who will be one of the five probables to be elevated to the Sacred College at the Consistory in December, was received with tremendous enthusiasm when he attended the banquet of the Westminster Province of the Knights of St. Columba, here.

Speaking at the banquet with reference to his designation as Cardinal, the Archbishop said that he regarded the honor not so much as a personal one, but as an honor to Great Britain, for which, he added, the Holy Father has the greatest affection. Archbishop Hinsley declared that he equated Pius XI as the greatest Pope since Innocent III or Gregory VII.

Catholics of England are deeply grateful over the elevation of Archbishop Hinsley. Pius XII, Secretary of the Sacred Congregation for Extraordinary Ecclesiastical Affairs, to the Sacred College. Archbishop Hinsley attended the Coronation of King George VI as Papal Envoy.

Much pleasure is also expressed by Catholics here at the designation of the Most Rev. Pius Hinsley, Archbishop of Lyons, as a school for apologetics.

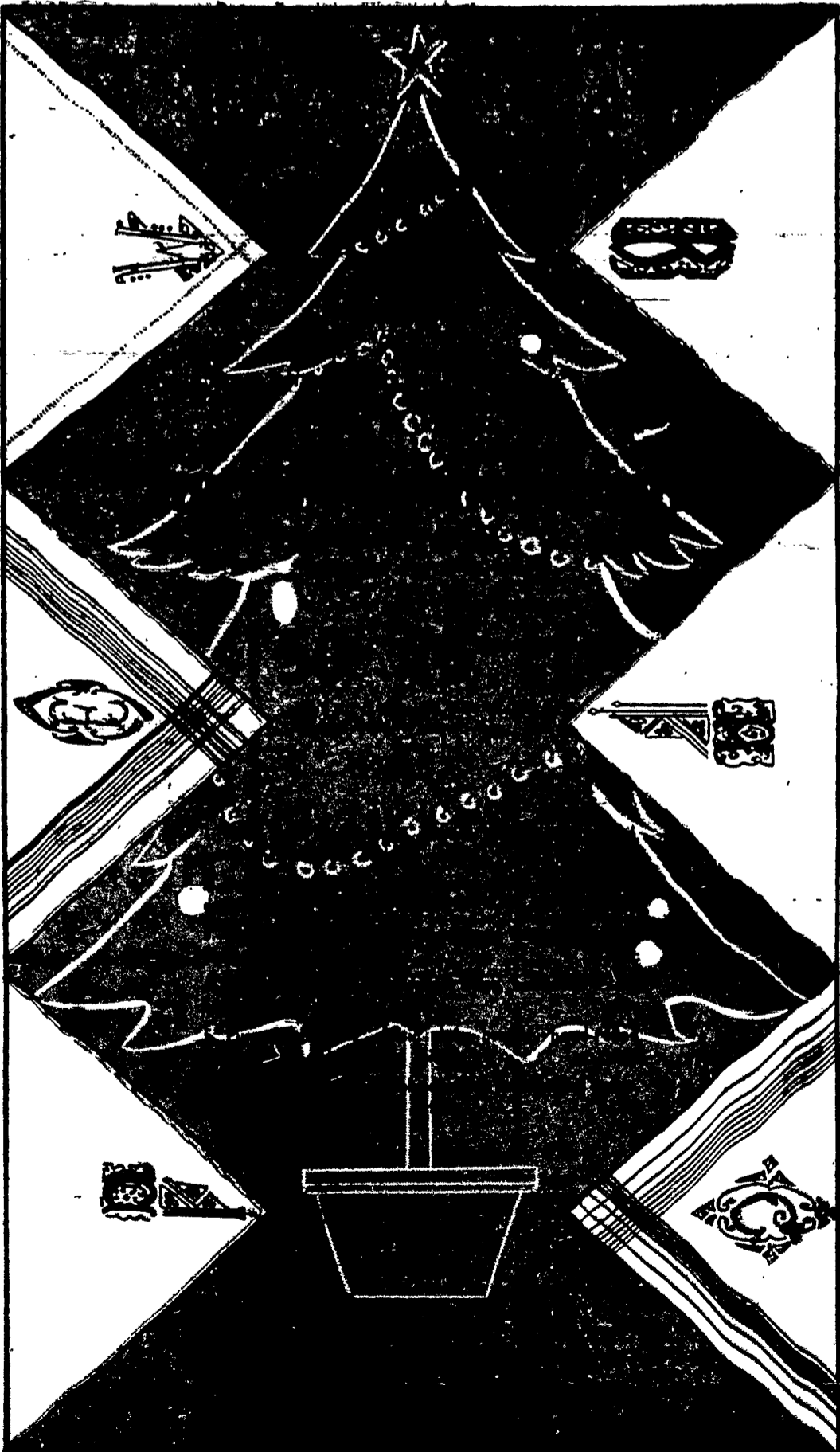
