Rising Cost of Living Causes Unrest in Ireland

DUBLIN—The rapidly rising cost of living is causing a great deal of unrest in the Free State, for example the cost of the four-pound loaf of bread in Dublin is now a shilling (about 24 cents). In London the same amount of bread costs ninepence (about 18 cents). Irish butter is cheaper in London and Belfast than it is in Dublin. Clothes and furniture are dearer here than across the water.
