Events

December, 1936 — A Franciscan missionary, the Rev. Christopher Sullivan, O.F.M., paid a visit to Rochester, coming here with a modern trailer which he will use in his far off mission in China, 500 miles from the Gobi desert. The trailer was equipped for Mass and confessions and had living accommodations for the missionary.

December, 1936 — Major Frederick Wagoner of Rochester Regiment, Knights of St. John was elected Colonel of the Regiment to succeed Frank H. Biel, new Supreme President of the Order, whose national duties made it necessary for him to retire from command of the Rochester Regiment.

December, 1936 — The Rev. Leo C. Money, diocesan director, Society for the Propagation of the Faith and managing editor of the CATHOLIC COURIER, and the Rev. John M. Daily, diocesan superintendent of Catholic Schools, left Rochester on a journey to include the International Eucharistic Congress in Manila, the mission fields of the Far East and continuing on around the world.

December, 1936 — Statements by the Rev. David Rhye Williams, of First Unitarian Church, which sought to defend the Communist controlled government of Spain, were answered by the CATHOLIC COURIER with reliable sources cited to disprove the erroneous statements.

December, 1936 — Appointment of the Rev. William J. Mahoney, C.M. F.C.D. M.A. to the position of dean of the School of Business Niagara University, was announced by the Very Rev. Joseph M. Noonan, C.M. F.C.D. M.A., president of the university. The appointment was Dr. Mahoney in charge of both the university and the Rochester Division, School of Business.

December, 1936 — The Rochester

December, 1936 — Masking as "a director of the Catholic newspaper, Cruz Y Raya," Eugenio Imaz headed a "Spanish Youth Front" delegation to Rochester to speak at the Baptist Temple under the auspices of "The Rochester Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy." The CATHOLIC COURIER announced that Imaz does not represent any Catholic group or agency; that Cruz y Raya is not a newspaper but a new magazine on the Madrid literary market; that it is not a Catholic publication, that Imaz is not an official of the magazine.

December, 1936 — Until children receive religious training and have instilled in them principles of morality anti-crime movements will make little progress, predicted the Rev. William F. Bergan, Chancellor of the diocese, in an address at the Rochester Chamber of Commerce.

December, 1936 — The Rev. Bernard A. Drew, ordained to the Holy Priesthood by Archbishop Mooney in Our Lady Chapel, St. Patrick's Cathedral, celebrated his first Solemn High Mass in Immaculate Conception Church. Father Drew left Rochester for an assignment in the Rapid City, South Dakota, diocese.

December, 1936 — Announcement made by the CATHOLIC COURIER that a campaign against Communism would be launched by the diocesan newspaper. First of a series of articles to be contributed by nationally known authorities among clergy and laity opposing Communism was to be written by the Rev. Dr. Edward Lodge Curran, pres-
