

lege at the Catholic University of America

Concern felt throughout the United States over the illness of the Holy Father stricken with a localization in his left leg was demonstrated in thousands of Catholic Churches of the nation as prayers were said by the faithful at direction of their pastors for the recovery of His Holiness, Pope Pius XI. Churches of all denominations in Chicago offered prayers for the Holy Father's recovery.

Solemn elevation of the Diocese of Los Angeles to the dignity of a Metropolitan See and solemn enthronement of the Most Rev. John J. Cantwell as first Archbishop was witnessed in the Cathedral of St. Vibiana, Los Angeles, Calif., by an impressive throng of Hierarchy and laity.

Proposal in the British Parliament to permit "Mercy Killings" was voted down in the House of Lords by a count of 36 to 14. The bill was opposed by Lord Dawson of Penn, the King's physician and the Archbishop of Canterbury, among others.

Industrial organization recommended by His Holiness, Pope Pius XI, would not only be infinitely better than the present system of individualism tempered by corporatism, but it would be immeasurably superior to the undesirable and impossible proposals of socialism, declared the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John A. Ryan, Director of the Department of Social Action, National Catholic Welfare Conference in Cincinnati address.

Church's position in Germany was aggravated when Viktor Lutze, supreme commander of the Nazi "Storm Troopers" in a letter to his pastor of St. Bernhard's Church, Berlin-Dahlem, flatly refused to have his newly born son, Adolph Hermann baptized a Christian thus severing all ties that had at least formally united him with the Catholic Church, the Nazi leader at the same time denounced the priesthood in violent terms.

General O'Duffy with a party of 40 men passed through London bound, it was reported, to join General Franco's forces in Spain. The Irish Brigade feeling that Christianity was being attacked and that it was their duty to lend a helping hand to their Spanish brothers in a common cause.

Warning against the errors of Socialistic and Communist education and stating that parents who wish to receive education must withdraw their children from schools in which these errors are taught, Mexican Bishops issued a pastoral stating that "failure to fulfill Christian duties, particularly when it is a matter of the education of children and youths must be considered."

Appointment of a central vigilance committee to safeguard Catholics of the Australia Commonwealth from dangers arising from vicious films was ordered in a resolution adopted at a plenary meeting of the Archbishops and Bishops of Australia at the conclusion of the All Australian Catholic Education Congress held at Adelaide. The resolution was in accordance with instructions of the Ency-

clical Letter "Vigilanti Cura," of His Holiness Pope Pius XI. Adoption of the film classification of the American Legion of Decency with addition of special reviewing of Australian films was projected as work of the vigilance committee.

Be ready "to endure, through Christ and their own consciences, even graver and more extreme sacrifices" Catholic faithful in Germany were exhorted by Bishops in a pastoral letter who urged the faithful to stand firm against the temptation to succumb to the pressure brought by Nazi authorities upon parents and employees.

Highly gratified was the Holy Father, His Holiness said, with the world-wide response that came to his Christmas message on peace delivered from the Pontiff's sick-bed on Christmas Eve.

Pastors in all parishes in the Archdiocese of New York were requested by His Eminence, Patrick Cardinal Hayes, to set up parish organizations of the "Catholic Youth Organization" to direct leisure time activities of youth.

Founder of the famed St. Joseph's Oratory at Montreal, Brother Andre, C.S.C., died at the age of ninety-one.

Again insisting that the struggle against Bolshevism is of little practical value, if not coupled with a sincere desire to uphold Christian principles, German Hierarchy issued a joint pastoral pledging their support for Chancellor Hitler's campaign to eradicate Communism, but emphasizing at the same time that "legal and actual freedom" is vital for the church.

Transfer of the Most Rev. John A. Duffy, Bishop of Syracuse to the See of Buffalo was announced from Vatican City.

Chamber of Deputies tabled the petition of the Masonic lodges of the Grand Orient of Mexico asking that the late Archbishops Francisco Orozco y Jimenez and Pascual Diaz y Barreto and the Most Rev. Jose Manrique y Zarate, Bishop of Huejutla be declared traitors to their country.

The Most Rev. Michael J. Gallagher, Bishop of Detroit, died.

Russian government was taken to task for its policy with regard to Spain by Leon Trotzky, himself a Communist but one differing with the present Soviet regime, in an interview at Coahuacan, Mexico.

"Were General Franco the ruthless militarist of communist propaganda he would soon finish Madrid," declared Captain Francis McCallagh, noted war correspondent in an uncorrected article in the Universe, Catholic newspaper of London, "for he has at his disposal two potent weapons which he has not tried yet. He has fire and famine."

Words of His Holiness Pope Pius XI were distorted in a new attack upon the Catholic Church launched by a Methodist organization in New York which used as a part of its argument quotations from an "ex-priest" who lectures against the Catholic.

that any priest of French origin in America, was a Jesuit, by presenting the very able Abbe Belmont—a member of the Society of St. Sulpice.

Francois Vachon De Belmont, fifth superior of the Sulpicians of Montreal, was born at Grenoble, France, in 1645 and died in 1732. He came to Canada in 1680 and was appointed missionary among the Indians of Montaigne. In 1700, he succeeded the Rev. Dollier de Casson as superior of the Order. In the vicinity of Rochester we remember the Rev. Dollier de Casson as, the companion of La Salle and the Rev. Rene Galigne in their visit to the Senecas in 1669.

The Abbe Belmont built the present Sulpician Seminary, which still may be seen in Montreal and which was erected on part of the site of the old seminary.

He was the author of many writings, including a Histoire du Canada in which appears his description of what we now call Boughton Hill, Victor, New York, as an ascent of three terraces.

It is to be remembered that on top of this hill was the large Seneca village of Ganagaro, to which de Denonville's army went the day after the battle in what is now modern High Street, Victor. (See Catholic Encyclopedia, Vol. II, p. 435.)
