June 1937 - Archbishop Mooney conferred 35 degrees on the graduating class of Nazareth College in impressive ceremony on the college campus. Honorary degree of doctor of letters was granted to Miss Blanche Thompson, Rochester scholar and poet.

June 1937 - Announcement made by the Rev. John M. Ball, director of the Catholic Rural Life Bureau of the Diocese of Rochester, that 43 rural religious vacation schools were opening in the diocese.

June 1937 - Appointments involving sixty priests were announced by the Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney, Administrator of the diocese. The Rev. Dr. Joseph E. Grady, president of Aquinas Institute was named Vice Rector of St. Bernard's Seminary. The Rev. Edward M. Lyons was named rector of St. Andrew's Seminary. Four new pastors were named.

June 1937 - For the first time in the history of Auburn Senior High School, the baccalaureate services were held in Emerson Auditorium instead of in various churches of the city and the baccalaureate sermon first to be delivered by a Catholic priest, was given by the Rev. Dr. William E. Cowen, pastor of St. Mary's Church, Auburn.

June 1937 - Two Holy Cross Fathers ordained at Notre Dame University, Indiana, returned to the home parishes to sing their First Solemn Masses. They are the Rev. John Lynch, C.S.S.R., who celebrated his first Solemn Mass in St. Francis de Sales Church, Geneva, and the Rev. Victor Boisvert, C.S.C., whose first

June 1937 - At an outdoor altar in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery, the Most Rev. Edward Mooney, Archbishop-elect of Detroit celebrated Mass for deceased members of the Knights of St. John and Ladies Auxiliaries.

June 1937 - Raised to the rank of Monsignor as they were made domestic prelates of the papal household were the Rev. William F. Bergan, Chancellor of the diocese, and the Rev. Joseph E. Grady, Vice-Rector of St. Bernard's Seminary. Announcement of their appointments by the Holy Father was made by Archbishop Mooney at Aquinas Institute commencement.

June 1937 - Ordained to the Holy Priesthood by Archbishop Mooney at St. Patrick's Cathedral were following graduates of St. Bernard's Seminary: the Reverend Fathers Philip E. McEgan, Raymond J. Wahl, J. Walter Carron, David B. Sufferhoff, John J. Leary, John M. Merklinger, Daniel W. Fraher, Francis J. Pegnam, Donald J. Murphy and Raymond M. Wuest.

June 1937 - The Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, representing Archbishop Mooney, dedicated the "log-cabin" chapel to St. Jude Thaddeus at Camp Stella Maris, diocesan boys' camp at Conesus Lake.

June 1937 - More than 500 attended the field day which marked the opening of the Columbian Squires' camp on Owaseo Lake.

July 1937 - Scholarship winners at Aquinas Institute announced by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph E. Grady, principal, were: St. Michael's Col-

lege Frank D. Golding, Niagara University, Francis P. Curry, Niagara University, School of Business, Wilfred C. Fuehrer, Rochester Business Institute, Eugene L. Roth, University of Dayton, Gerard P. LaMay, Villanova College, Theodore V. Ferris.

July 1937 - A full tuition scholarship at Nazareth College offered by the New York State Knights of Columbus, was awarded to Miss Lucile Meyer, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew J. Meyer, 99 Thomas Ave. Announcement was made by Grand Knight Leo F. Rombaut of Rochester Council.

July 1937 - With Archbishop Mooney presiding, Miss Iorantia Stropel of Detroit, Mich., received the habit of the Discalced Carmelite Sisters at a solemn ceremony in the Carmelite Monastery, 1530 East Avenue.

July 1937 - The Eagle award of the Boy Scouts was presented to the Rev. R. Felix White, Maryknoll priest of Geneva, by the Finger Lakes Scout Council prior to his leaving for his mission post in Korea.

July 1937 - The Rev. Gerald C. Lambert was named Diocesan Director of Catholic Charities by Archbishop Mooney, administrator of the diocese who announced a new set-up in Catholic Charities activities in diocese. The Rev. Hubert A. Busky, M.A., was named Director of the Family and Child Placing Division of Rochester Catholic Charities and of Elmira Catholic Service Society. The Rev. Joseph E. Vogt was appointed Director of the Social Action Division. William T. Nolan was named Director of Finance and Budget Division. Father Lambert succeeded the Most Rev. Walter A.
