Church and from a priest who has been forbidden to exercise his priestly functions.

Erection of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine in every parish of the Archdiocese of New York was directed as a grave obligation by His Eminence Patrick Cardinal Hayes of New York in a letter read in all the churches of the Archdiocese.

Flight of eight residents in the isolated Catholic mission on the Horns day river, 400 miles east of Akavik, several hundred miles within the Arctic, who faced death by starvation, was described to the Edmonton Journal by Matt Berry, Canadian Airways pilot, after completing a hazardous 4,400 aerial rescue flight. Rescued were the Most Rev. Peter Falaise, Coadjutor Bishop of the Mechelen, a priest whose name was not learned, Brother Grant and three Eskimo children.

With twenty-five Bishops attending the All Australian Catholic Education Congress, one of events in year's celebration in honor of the foundation of South Australia, 100 years ago was held in Adelaide. In a prepared statement, the Australian Hierarchy criticized the government's policy on education citing grievances.

Knights of Columbus in New Haven declined the opportunity of inviting a representative of the Communist party to address them and refused statements in the representative's letter concerning the Catholic Church and Communism.

FEBRUARY, 1937

Amid scenes unprecedented in the Philippine Islands, the only Christian country in the Orient, made impressive by the deep devotion of the thousands attending, the Thirty-third International Eucharistic Congress opened in Manila's colorful Luneta Park. Presiding was His Eminence Dennis Cardinal Dougherty, Papal Legate. Present were dignitaries of the Church and other pilgrims from all parts of the world.

Included in succor sent to sufferers from floods in the Ohio valley were thousands of dollars sent from churches, schools and organizations in the Diocese of Rochester.

For the part he played in the return of the body of Father Damien from the leper colony at Molokai to his native Belgium, President Franklin D. Roosevelt was presented in Washington with a medal struck to commemorate the occasion. Presentation was made by the Rev. Paul Vanhoutte of Louvain, Provincial of the Belgian Province of the Fathers of the Sacred Hearts.

Gil Robles, leader of Accion Popular party in Spain was reported in London dispatch as declaring that his party was entirely united to the nationalist cause and that it would support the cause "with all its moral strength, with all its financial resources and with the life of every one of its members."

With the voice of the Holy Father coming through the air from Vatican City to bring His Holiness' blessing on the thirty-third International Eucharistic Congress in Manila, the impressive ceremonies were brought to a close as 150,000 people of various nations assembled for Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in Luneta Park.

Answering a cable from Roy W. Howard, president and editor of the New York World-Telegram, General Francisco Franco, nationalist leader, declared that if the Rights with the present Spanish Civil War, a Concordat will be drawn up with the Vatican to determine the Catholic Church's position under the new government.

That His Holiness, Pope Pius XI who stood and walked for the first time since being taken ill two months previous and showed no ill effects would gradually increase his exercise within limits prescribed by his physician, Dr. Minina, Milan, as as not to overtax his strength, was announced from Vatican City.

Staying of a boy and girl attending a clandestine Mass at Orizaba, Vera Cruz, roused the people to a high pitch and resulted in the reopening of half a dozen churches. Mexican Federal troops who were rushed to the scene to preserve order looked on but showed no disposition to reclaim the churches or disperse the detained Catholics.

Frank Murphy, Irish-Catholic Governor of Michigan, was rightfully acclaimed by political Washington as the hero in the settlement of the General Motors strike.

Declaration that the "sit-down" strike as was resorted to in the settled labor dispute in the automobile industry is "offensive to our laws and institutions and not justified" was made by the Rt. Rev. Migr. John A. Ryan, Director of the Department of Social Action, N.C.W.C., Washington, in an interview in the New York Sun.

Refugees from Spain reaching Paris took of the tragic plight of some 50,000 war orphans roaming about the country, without any refuge to which they could turn.

While the Rt. Rev. Migr. John A. Ryan, director of Social Action Department, N.C.W.C. came to the support of President Roosevelt's Supreme Court plan, the Rev. Paul L. Blakely, S.J., scored the proposed changes in America, national Jesuit weekly.

"Civilization is coming to a most precarious crisis, one of the gravest in history, and men under 40 will live to see a revolutionary clash on a large scale," Hilaire Belloc, noted English writer and historian, declared to a class at Fordham University Graduate School as he made his debut as a member of the faculty.

While President Cardenas and Governor Miguel Aleman studied the action of Catholics in forcing open some of the churches in Vera Cruz state a new outbreak of anti-Catholic violence flared up near Mexico City. At Santa Isabel armed men forcibly removed the Rev. Pedro Makdonado, S.J., from his domicile and without accusing him of anything beat him into insensibility. The priest died later in a hospital.

MARCH, 1937

The gift of "Inisfada," psaltal Long Island residence of Mrs. Nicholas F. Brady to the Maryland-New York Province of the Society of Jesus was confirmed in New York by the Very Rev. W. Coleman Nevils, S.J., speaking for Mrs. Brady.

All members of the Soviet foreign service, including all diplomatic officers abroad, were reported in a Berlin dispatch, quoting Moscow reports as having been ordered to take out membership in the Godless organization as of January 1, 1937.

General ringing of church bells announced to the people of Cordoba in the state of Vera Cruz, Mexico, that President Cardenas, heeding the petition of the citizens, had ordered the church keys to be turned over to the Catholics of that city.

The Most Rev. Luis Martinez, Titular Archbishop of Mistia and Coadjutor Archbishop of Morelia, was named Archbishop of Mexico City by His Holiness, Pope Pius XI.

"The totalitarian conception of the State is contrary to the dogmatic teaching of the Church," declared the Rev. M. Booy, Chaplain of the J.U.C. Catholic university students' organization of Liege, in a statement warning the members against the Rex movement in Belgium.

First steps toward the beatification of Brother Andre were to be taken as soon as a committee, studying reported cures, had completed its investigation, it was announced at the Oratory of St. Joseph, internationally famous shrine in Montreal.

Members of the Irish Hierarchy in Lenten pastorals all expressed grave concern over the menace of Communism.
