

**The World in Review**

Five Bishops, the priest directors of youthful activities in 15 Archdioceses and Dioceses, and laymen, laywomen and youth from the Western part of the United States took part in the First Regional Conference of the National Catholic Youth Council in Salt Lake City. The Conference was held under the patronage of the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, D. D., then Bishop of Salt Lake.

Denouncing the student "peace strike" as an attempt by radicals to "cause" dissension, strife and even bloodshed in America, the National Catholic Alumni Federation, representing 300,000 Catholic college graduates urged in a statement issued at New York City that a Federal investigation be started of the forces behind the "strike."

May, 1937

Virtually killing all hopes for the restoration of peace between Church and State in Germany, Chancellor Hitler in a May Day address voiced a threat. He said that the Nazi regime would see to it that the church in Germany would be "repressed to the spiritual tasks which are theirs if they attempt to encroach on any sort of letters, Encyclicals, etc., to arrogate to themselves rights which belong to the State."

Representatives of Catholic organizations were prominent among men and women of various religious denominations who appeared before License Commissioner Paul Moss in New York at public hearings where vigorous protests were made against issuing new licenses to any of the burlesque theaters in the metropolis.

That the American secular press as a whole "has failed in its job of gathering and distributing unbiased and reliable news from both the rival camps in Spain," was charged by Michael Williams, Editor of The Commonwealth in the May 7 issue of that publication.

Funds appropriated to the Board of Education for transportation of school children must be used to provide equal transportation for children attending public and private schools, it was ruled by Dr. Frank P. Graves, Commissioner of Education, in Albany.

Catholic population of the United States including Alaska and the Hawaiian Islands was placed at 20,959,134 by the Official Catholic Directory for 1937.

"Radio Station WLWL, operated by the Paulist Fathers at 415 West 59th Street, New York City, is to be sold to Mr. Arde Bulova, watch manufacturer. Efforts extending over a long period of time to make Station WLWL self-supporting have met with repeated failures." Thus did the Paulist Fathers announce the passing of their radio station which caused widespread regret in Catholic circles.

The Catholic Register, Archdiocesan weekly newspaper in Toronto reported that a community of Anglican nuns at Vancouver had decided to enter the Catholic Church in a body.

Dioceses throughout the United States held special services to commemorate the eightieth birthday of His Holiness, Pope Pius XI.

Urging that "the least we can do to help the German Church is to show our open sympathy in this hour of trial," His Eminence George Cardinal Mundelein, Archbishop of Chicago, in an address to his clergy at their quarterly conference, assailed the Anti-Catholic propaganda of the German Government.

June, 1937

In one of the most violent diatribes he ever delivered, Dr. Josef Goebbels, German Minister of Propaganda expressed a "sharp warning" in a Berlin speech and threatened that "some persons in very high position would be killed in court under oath" if attacks from abroad

against the Nazi regime continued in connection with the recent so-called immorality trials.

Receiving former Governor Alfred E. Smith of New York in private and later a public audience, His Holiness Pope Pius XI praised Mr. Smith as "worthy... representing all that is American in America."

That the Catholic Church in Spain had been defamed by "viciously false Communist propaganda," was charged by the Rev. Bernard Grimley, editor of the Catholic Times, London, England, at a mass meeting of 15,000 persons held at Madison Square Garden, New York.

Governor Lehman signed the Numan-Moffatt Child Labor Act declaring illegal after January 1, 1938 in New York State the sale of products whether made in New York State or elsewhere and produced in whole or in part through the use of child labor.

Tommy Kelly, 12-year-old student of St. Raymond's parochial school, The Bronx, New York, was chosen to enact the role of Tom Sawyer, typical American boy immortalized by Mark Twain, in motion pictures.

Regardless of motives which may have been behind it, the plan to bring to the United States a shipment of children from the Basque province in Spain was condemned as an ill-advised move by His Eminence, William Cardinal O'Connell, Archbishop of Boston.

The Most Rev. Joseph F. Rummel, Archbishop of New Orleans, in a statement, attacked the action taken by the House of Delegates of the American Medical Association in approving birth control. Vigorous opposition was also expressed by the Federation of Catholic Physicians Guilds to the same action.

Formation of a new type of "legion of decency" to combat firms dealing in contraceptives and doctors approving their use was proposed by the Rev. Ignatius W. Cox, S.J., of Fordham University as a partial answer to the American Medical Association's approval of several recommendations of one of its committees, constituting recognition of artificial birth control.

Hundreds of thousands of Catholic school children all over Bavaria were affected when the Nazi Government took over operation of 966 parochial schools, which Adolf Wagner, Bavarian Minister of the Interior, announced would be transformed into secular institutions.

The Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office issued a decree calling upon the episcopate and clergy throughout the world to follow rigorously the teachings of the Church with reference to forms of devotions associated with holy images.

Bells ringing in welcome throughout the city, scenes of rejoicing by large sections of the populace, and instances where the Rightist forces were greeted as deliverers were reported of Franco's entry into Bilbao as it was being surrendered.

July, 1937

"It is evident that in great part difficulties which occur in religious matters in Mexico arise out of the fact that State Legislatures exceed their powers," the Most Rev. Luis M. Martinez, Archbishop of Mexico, stated in special interview. The Primate discussed the Supreme Court decision granting the protection of the Court to three priests in the State of Chihuahua.

German Catholics in Czechoslovakia whose speeches and manifestations were not restricted by any State power defended in the press and public gatherings the good reputation of Germany's priests and members of religious Orders.

The Rev. John P. Boland, of Buffalo was named by Governor Lehman to be Chairman of the New York State Labor Relations Board.
