A blessing from His Holiness Pope Pius XI was conveyed to Catholic Scouts and leaders by the Most Rev. Francis J. L. Beckman, Archbishop of Dubuque, at the great solemn pontifical Field Mass at the First National Jamboree of Boy Scouts of America in Washington. The Archbishop cited the struggle of evil agencies today for control of youth.

That Soviet Russia was not only supplying arms to the Leftists in Spain, but also "liquidating" those segments of the Spanish Popular Front opposed to Communistic rule was charged by Miss Emma Goldman, Rochester's exiled anarchist, in a letter from London to the New York Times following her return from Spain.

After closing the Church of Santa Catalina de Sena in Mexico City where the image of Our Lord of the Cloak is venerated by Mexican Catholics, the Government reopened it for a Protestant sect.

New York State's highest tribunal—the Court of Appeals—dismissed an appeal from a decision by Supreme Court Justice Phillip A. McCook declaring the Kelly-McCreery school bus law constitutional. Appeal was dismissed without an opinion on the ground that the constitutional question was not the only one involved.

By radio the vast outpouring of pilgrims gathered at Lourdes of the French National Eucharistic Congress and the dedication of the Basilica of St. Therese heard His Holiness Pope Pius XI, speak to them from Castelgandolfo. The Holy Father called for prayers that "to this world so distraught and confused, and to all peoples who are so oppressed by the miseries of today and so fearful of tomorrow, God may grant a little tranquility in order and peace with a return to those ways which are the only ways—the recognition of His Divine Sovereignty, obedience to His holy laws and the practice of justice and charity, the more humbly towards those who have less and who, for that very reason, are in greater need and suffering."

Extension of Confraternity of Christian Doctrine study clubs to over 200 secular college campuses was made possible by the Federation of College Catholic Clubs at its 22nd annual national convention in Denver.

A heart attack proved fatal to Guglielmo Marconi, sixty-three-year-old inventor of the wireless. Notified of Marconi's death, the Pope sent a special blessing.

The Most Rev. John T. McNicholas, O.P., Archbishop of Cincinnati, designated 19 priests of the archdiocese to "assist labor, to be helpful in industrial disputes, in a word, to do all they can in giving sane direction to laboring groups."

Courage of His Eminence George Cardinal Mundelein, Archbishop of Chicago, in his outspoken defense of things religious was lauded by His Holiness Pope Pius XI in a discourse to a group of Chicago pilgrims in Vatican City.

A committee headed by members of the hierarchy was formed to aid Catholic refugees from Germany. The committee was authorized at the annual meeting of the National Catholic Welfare Conference in Washington, November 1936. The Most Rev. Joseph F. Rummel, Archbishop of New Orleans, was named chairman.

Revealing that he was still alive, the Rev. Manuel Grana, Spanish Correspondent of the CATHOLIC COURIER and N.C.W.C. News Service, who for almost a year had escaped capture and avoided death in Red Spain, sent a remarkable story describing Bilbao's siege and fall to the diocesan newspaper.

An appeal to employers and workers to strive to avoid all resort to strike violence and to settle their disputes at a conference table was made by the Most Rev. Joseph Schrembs, Bishop of Cleveland.

Eight residents of Las Casas, Capital of Chiapas, Mexico, were arrested and placed in a Federal military prison the same day, charged with forcibly opening the doors of churches in that city.

History will record the decadence of those nations which have excluded God from their destiny and will reproach those who have violated consciences. His Excellency, the Most Rev. Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States, declared in a Dubuque address. The Archbishop spoke at a dinner on the opening day of the year's celebration of the centenary of the erection of the Diocese of Dubuque.

Erection of the new Archdiocese and Province of Detroit took place when the Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney, fourth Bishop of Rochester, was installed as first Archbishop of Detroit in a brilliant setting at which 10 Archbishops and 60 Bishops were present.

Practice of social justice in all departments of American life was set down as one of the fundamental principles of home missionary activity by speakers at the Tenth National Convention of the Catholic Students' Mission Crusade meeting in Cleveland.

The Spanish Episcopacy, represented by two Cardinals, six Archbishops, 35 Bishops and five Vicar Capitulars, addressed a joint Pastoral to the Bishops of the World. With unanimous authority they set forth facts that have characterized the civil war in Spain. They refuted false affirmations, condemned interpretations which distorted facts to influence opinion abroad, and said of the taking up of arms that the Spanish people had either to succumb to Communism or free themselves from its destruction by means of arms.

Conferring his warmest praise on the parochial school system of the United States, the Holy Father declared in a general audience at Vatican City that he, like all the Bishops and priests, desires that every parish shall have its parochial school.

Asserting that the drama, as presented through such groups as members of the Catholic Theater Conference, has approval of the Church, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Fulton J. Sheen of the Catholic University of America in keynote of the second convention of the Conference, declared that Catholics must take hold of the drama "to propagandize truth." He urged that the drama groups "never descend to the uncharitable."

People are reducing their capacity for thinking by turning from reading to the perusal of picture magazines, the Most Rev. James Edward Kearney, Bishop-elect of Rochester, declared in a New York sermon.

The theory and practice of social progress through class conflict was assailed by the Rev. Joseph F. MacDonnell, S.J., of Weston College, Weston, Mass., in addressing the eighty-second national convention of the Catholic Central Verein of America, meeting in Hartford, Conn. The Most Rev. Maurice F. McAuliffe, Bishop of Hartford, was host to the convention.

Speaking of the Spanish war in an interview granted the Rev. Manuel Grana, N.C.W.C. News Service Correspondent, His Eminence Isidro Cardinal Goma y Tomas, Archbishop of Toledo, and Primate of Spain, said: "This war is a war of principles, of one civilization against another, of Marxist materialism against the spiritual values of our Christian civilization. So true is this, that on the occasion of the insurrection of the Army, the national soul became incorporated in the military movement in vast and profound currents."

Continuance of their vigorous campaign against Atheistic Communism and a renewal of their protest against the persecution of the Catholic Church in Mexico were voted by the Knights of Columbus at the close of the fifty-fifth Supreme Convention in San Antonio, Texas.


