**DEDICATION OF A NEW PIPE ORGAN IN GROTON, N. Y.**

GROTON—Last Thursday was indeed a Day of Thanksgiving for the members of St. Anthony's Church, as it marked the date of the installation and dedication of a new pipe organ to be used in the services of the Church.

At 8 o'clock that morning the Pastor, the Rev. John M. Bollinger, and his assistants, blessed the new instrument with the solemn prayers of the Church and dedicated it to the service of Almighty God. Then the strains of the inspiring hymn "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name" resounded through the building and united with the prayers of thanksgiving from the hearts of the listeners to ascend to the Throne of God in appreciation for the many favors bestowed upon all. During the Mass which followed the solemn blessing of the organ, its music added greatly to the impressiveness of the services. The organ, a product of the Kohl Organ Company, of Rochester, N. Y. is made up of 243 pipes, the longest of which is 10 feet long and 8 inches square, and the smallest one-half inch long and three-sixteenths of an inch in diameter. The pipes are set in an oak cabinet pivoted to one side of the choir loft. The console, which is detachable and set toward the center of the loft, has 2 manuals and pedals. The organ is of the latest type electric action to control the air entering the pipes to cause them to speak. It contains 268 electric magnets, 3 1/2 miles of electric wiring and 1,350 silver electric contacts. The fan blower in the basement maintains a constant flow of air of 350 cubic feet a minute at a pressure of 4 pounds to the square inch. An added reason for thanksgiving came with the announcement of the pastor that a check for \$12,000 in full payment had been handed to Mr. Kohl at the completion of his work.
