**Dictatorships and Paganism Linked**

A worldwide rise of paganism is fostering the rapid spread of dictatorships with the 'whip hands' seeking to defy themselves, John B. Kennedy noted today.

Speaking before the Retail Solid Fuel Merchant Association Mr. Kennedy who last spoke here at the Catholic Press Convention here declared that a quick return to a spiritual standard both in business and everyday life, is the only way to avoid materialism.

The American spirit of co-operation, he said, which has as evolved itself in this democracy will never permit the ugly hand of a dictator to rear here. A bulwark to the democratic principle of government will bear an iron rule of a totalitarian state.

Mr. Kennedy added: "Democracy is the one form of government that follows true concepts of Christianity."

The human heart is an abyss which defies all calculations.

**TWO U. S. PRELATES ELEVATED BY POPE TO ARCHBISHOPS**

three new United States dioceses are expected to be announced at the Public Consistory today.

The Ecclesiastical Province of Newark embraces all of the State of New Jersey, which heretofore was part of the Ecclesiastical Province of New York. Besides the Metropolitan See of Newark, the Province will have as Suffragan sees the already existing Diocese of Trenton and the new Diocese of Camden, which will embrace only the State of Ohio and the State of Indiana. The Metropolitan See of Louisville will embrace territory which heretofore has been part of the Ecclesiastical Province of Cincinnati. The Province of Cincinnati heretofore will embrace only the State of Ohio and the State of Indiana. The Metropolitan See of Louisville will have as Suffragan sees the Diocese of Nashville, which embraces the State of Tennessee, the Diocese of Covington in Kentucky, and the new Diocese of Owensboro in Kentucky.

Archbishop Noel Schuler, first as Bishop of Trenton and then as Bishop of Newark, Archbishop Walsh at various times held all of the State of New Jersey under his episcopal jurisdiction. He undertakes his new office with a widespread reputation as a scholar, with a wealth of experience, and with a brilliant record of accomplishments.

Born at Parker's Landing, Pa., in 1873, Bishop Walsh made studies at the College and Seminary of St. Bonaventure, Allegany, N. Y., and at the Pontifical Roman Seminary, Rome. At the latter he received the degree Doctor of Divinity and Doctor of Canon Law. In 1928 St. Bonaventure conferred the degree Doctor of Laws upon him.

Ordained to the priesthood in 1900, Bishop Walsh returned to the United States from Rome and became an Assistant at St. Joseph's Cathedral, Buffalo. In the same year he was named Secretary to Bishop James E. Quigley, later Archbishop of Chicago, and occupied the same post with his successor, Bishop Charles H. Colton. Consecrated Bishop of Trenton on July 25, 1918, Bishop Walsh governed that See with distinction until he was transferred to the Diocese of Newark on March 2, 1928. In 1922 the Holy Father honored him with appointment as an Assistant at the Pontifical Throne. In 1924 he was again honored when he was designated to give the Eucharist blessing in the presence of the Pope, a privilege heretofore accorded any American Bishop. The incident occurred while Bishop Walsh was in Rome for the beatification of Blessed Lucia Filippini, founder of the Magistrae.

Archbishop Floersch was ordained to the priesthood and consecrated Bishop in Rome. He went to the Diocese of Louisville first as a Conductor of the Holy Father's staff on the staff of the Apostolic Delegation in Washington for a decade. Born at Nashville, Tenn., October 26, 1886, Archbishop Floersch received his early education in his parochial schools of that city. Later he went to Rome to study at Propaganda College, and he was ordained in the Eternal City on June 10, 1911. He returned to the United States and was stationed at St. Patrick's Church, Memphis.
