IN ONE EAR

The most important musical event of 1937 and possibly the greatest happening in the musical history of radio occurred on Christmas night when Arturo Toscanini, the illustrious Italian maestro, began his series of concert broadcasts on the NBC Symphony Orchestra.

For his second appearance on a coast-to-coast Red and Blue Network, Toscanini has chosen three masterworks of outstanding appeal which will be played in a year's Night from 10:00 to 11:30 P. M.

The program will include the "Missa Solenne" by Verdi, the "Missa in Sol" by Brahms, the "Missa in G" by Haydn, the "Missa in C" by Mozart, and the "Missa in D" by Schubert.

The ninety-minute concert will be carried by the stations of the United States including of course WHAM, and will also be short-waved to listeners throughout the world by NBC's International short-wave stations.

The top of the way comes to WHAM, the National Broadcasting Company, having caught the fever have arranged a special series of broadcasts that will carry the stay-at-home picture of the life and gaiety to be found in America on New Year's Eve. In fact, NBC has combined the Red and Blue networks in a country-wide network that will remain open until 8:00 A. M. on New Year's Eve bringing a parade of the finest dance bands in New York, Chicago, Denver, the West Coast and Hawaii to those who wish to listen.

The NBC Blue network will carry a continuous non-stop dance parade from 10:00 to 12:30 P. M. presenting successively in half hour periods the music of Paul Martin, Jimmy Dorsey, Larry Thompson and Freddie Martin. Other features of NBC's New Year's Eve schedule will be the booming of Big Ben, the London's New Year's Day and a Water Night Service from Riverside Church in New York. Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick will deliver a New Year's message and the famous Riverside Church bell will ring in 1938 in the United States during the latter program.

On New Year's Day the Metropolitan Opera Company will present via WHAM Mozart's "Don Giovanni." The broadcast will start at 8:00 P. M.

Climaxing the 1937 football season, the Rose Bowl and the Bowl battles will be broadcast on New Year's Day. The Rose Bowl game starts at 4:45 and the Sugar Bowl game goes on the Red Net starting at 2:00 P. M.

Edward M. High, NBC's chief singer has a group of faithful followers who up in Labrador according to an interesting communication recently received from the Grenfell Mission. Elin Schallert, motion picture commentator and critic, whose interviews with film celebrities and previews of latest pictures are heard weekly over WHAM, has been signed to a new 52 week contract which will take her through her third year of broadcasting over the coast-to-coast network of the Blue chain.

On Monday, January 3 Amos and Andy will change sponsors. After eight years with the Peacock Company, the boys are now going to work under the sponsorship of the Campbell Soup Company, Bill Hay who has introduced the boys since their first appearance, will continue as their announcer under the new contract.

Flag Salute
Denial Legal
Court Rules

Religious Convictions and Constitution Do Not Clash Judge States

PHILADELPHIA (CNS)—While noting that "of course" one holds the opinion that "of course" one holds the opinion that public school officials lack authority to expel a pupil because of religious convictions, to salute the flag.

The decision was rendered in an action brought by a parent, a member of Jehovah's Witnesses, whose two children were expelled from the Minersville school authorities adopted a regulation requiring all teachers and pupils of the schools to salute the flag as a part of their daily exercises. Refusal to do so was held to be a violation of insubordination. When his children were expelled from the Minersville schools, the parent brought action for damages against the school authorities for depriving his children of their rightful education. He said he was not financially able to educate his children privately and that he could not conscientiously permit them to salute the flag.

Judge Minto said the action of the minor defendants in refusing for conscience's sake to salute the flag, a ceremony which they deem an act of worship to be rendered to God alone was within the rights guaranteed by the Pennsylvania Constitution. "The conclusion is inescapable," he added, "that the requirement of that ceremony as a condition of the performance of their duty to attend the public schools violated the Pennsylvania Constitution and infringed the liberty guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment."

Denial of liberty of conscience means liberty for each individual to decide for himself what is to him religious. The judge added that if any individual sincerely bases his acts or refusal to salute the flag on religious grounds, must be accepted as such and may not be interfered with if it becomes necessary to do so in connection with the exercise of the police power, that is, if it appears that the public safety, health or morals or personal right will be prejudiced by them.

To permit public officers to determine whether the views of individuals are sincere and religiously sincerely undertaken on religious grounds is in fact based on convictions religious in character would be to sound the death knell of religious liberty and doctrine this court cannot subscribe to," he concluded.

Without being over-sanguine one may be justified in hoping that a good number of priests and laymen will follow the temporal power of bishop Mar Severius and find peace in the bosom of the Catholic Church.

Mar Severius was born in Malappally in the Travancore region of Travancore. He came from the ancient and respectable family of Valakuzhi. He is a close relative of the late Mar Vunyanus great Jacobite Metropolitan of Malankara, who died in the temporal power of the Jacobite Patriarch of Antioch in 1914 and the predecessor and "guru" of Mar Ivanios.

Mar Severius is 42 years old. He passed the B. A. Examination of the University of Madras and was employed for six years as a teacher in the Mar Gregorios Memorial Jacobite English School. He was also the master of the boarding institution attached to the school. As a teacher he was keenly interested in sports especially football. He was popular with his fellow teachers, was greatly loved and respected by the boys and appreciated by every one with whom he came in contact. He was a rare earnest of purpose and showed a rare freedom of spirit, ready to act upon conviction.
