Conditions Deployable Anyone familiar with conditions in Nazi jails can picture for him self the sufferings to which this martyr priest is now again to be subjected. Prisoners are often kept in solitary confinement for months and are not permitted to roading whatever except for one day a week. They are frequently kept in dark cells for or distraction of any sort All thus of course amounts to an intellectual torture as can only be devised by diabolic minds The Catholic lay youth lead r Steber, of Duesseldorf, was blinded be-cause of his sollary confinement in idark cell for many months
