K. C. Offers Student Essay Prizes

An essay contest on "Godless Communism," open to all seniors of the Catholic High Schools of the Diocese, is announced today by Grand Knight Leo F. Romberg of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus. Carrying on their relentless Crusade against Communism, a nationwide effort among Knights of Columbus in Rochester, Knights have generously arranged for the contest with the diocesan office of the "Confraternity of Christian Doctrine."

Three Prizes Offered
A prize of \$150 will be awarded the best paper; \$100, the second, and \$50 for the third. This contest, unique in that it is the first competition between students of the Catholic High Schools of the Diocese, has been arranged by the K. of C. to stimulate interest in the Lenten Discussion Club program of the Confraternity. The plan calls for an essay of 1,000 words on "Godless Communism" to be written by any members of the senior class in the various Catholic High Schools throughout the diocese. Deadline, Feb. 23. An elimination contest in each school will narrow the entries to two papers to be handed in to the Confraternity Office by noon, February 23. Program of the Knights of Columbus calls for full cooperation with the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, Grand Knight Romberg said today in announcing the contest. For the past two years, Rochester Council has been studying various phases of Communism and during the present year has been writing on the Holy Father's Encyclical on Atheistic Communism. It is expected that many of the knights will volunteer to their pastors to lead groups in their own parishes in Rochester and wherever K. of C. councils exist in the diocese.

Bishop Points Need For Catholic Women's Influence

From the contributions made to the world by Catholic women through twenty centuries, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester drew inspiration for his address at the dinner given in his honor, Monday evening at the Rochester Club. The Bishop was heard by 440 Catholic women, one of the largest attendance at a dinner of the club in many years. Guests also included the Most Rev. Archbishop Thomas F. Hickcy, the Rt. Rev. Magr. William M. Hart, V.G., and Mrs. Margaret Feary, mother and the Misses Margaret and Loreto Feary, sisters of the Most Rev. Walter A. Feary, Bishop of Syracuse. "A Noble Tradition" "Your Club," Bishop Kearney said, "has followed a noble tradition of service which has characterized the mothers of men throughout the ages and has added to that tradition the experience and culture of twenty centuries of Christian faith and practice." Reviewing the deeds of outstanding Catholic women from the time of the Blessed Mother down through the years, the Bishop said: "Woman, as a sex, has given more to culture than modern commentators ever knew. She has shared in the establishment of religious and educational institutions from the earliest period of which there is any authentic record."

Threaten Home
"It is not my purpose to depreciate these hidden and homely virtues so long celebrated in song and story, but I do pause mid the heat of the day, to inquire where today does the home end?" "Is it within the four walls of a house?" the Bishop asked. "Certainly not in our own time when strange influences and voices are threatening to break unceremoniously into your home. Certainly not in our time when a mother's influence must extend to chaparring a youngster who rides seventy miles an hour in rumble seats, comes face to face with a sex ridden drama and literature and hears an outside world answer at the morality he learned at his mother's knee."

THROATS BLESSED BY BISHOP AT HOSPITAL AND ORPHAN HOME

Blessing of throats by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, took place this morning at the Forest of St. Blaise in St. Mary's Hospital and this afternoon in St. Mary's Boys Home, St. Patrick's Girls Home and St. Joseph's Orphan Home. At the Hospital, the Bishop blessed the throats of doctors on the staff in the Chapel, and of the Sisters of Charity in the Rochester community in the chapel of the hospital. Later, the Bishop went through the hospital blessing the throats of the patients. Children of the homes had their throats blessed in the afternoon. On Candlemas Day, Wednesday, the Bishop spoke to the seminarians of St. Andrew's Seminary in St. Patrick's Church. The Bishop celebrated Mass at 8 o'clock and a procession of students and priests carrying lighted candles took place. Music was furnished by the seminary choir.

Duffy Relative Dies In Los Angeles

Word has been received here by former Supreme Court Justice James P. Duffy of the death of his grandniece, Michael F. O'Dea in Los Angeles, January 23. Born in Toronto, Mr. O'Dea came to Rochester, where he was reared. He left Rochester in 1824, the year that Justice Duffy's mother died.
