Holy Sepulchre Cemetery

The main office of Holy Sepulchre Cemetery has been newly located at the Cemetery Grounds at 2461 Lake Avenue. All the business of the Cemetery will be transacted through these offices. The transfer from the old address at 400 Plymouth Avenue North was made necessary by the sale of the Cathedral property.

Owing to the growth of Holy Sepulchre Cemetery and the rapidly increasing cost of maintaining grounds in proper condition it has become necessary to charge lot owners their heirs for the ordinary care of lots not endowed with Perpetual Care, viz. those lots which were purchased before April 1, 1923. The price of such lots included only the cost of the land and made no provision for the care of same.

In accordance with a recent regulation passed by the Cemetery, and which lots are subject to an annual fee for cutting and mowing grass on same. Charge for this labor varies according to size of lots:

2 and 4 grave lots \$1.00 per season
 6 and 7 grave lots 1.50 per season
 12 and 14 grave lots 3.00 per season

Beginning April, 1937 labor costs will be charged against lots not endowed with Perpetual Care and such costs are payable annually.

The Perpetual Care endowment eliminates the present and future uncertainty of the care of graves and gives the security of their proper upkeep at a comparatively small cost. Kindly call at the office for detailed information regarding such arrangements.

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
