Library Signpost ROLL-CALL With Fr. Herbert Walker's lecture on Modern Catholic Literature occupying the forefront of attention in next week's schedule it is timely to call the roll of the great names who have initiated and contributed notably to the great revival of Catholic letters in the last half-century. JOHN HENRY NEWMAN (1801-1890) Great convert from Anglicanism, leading light of the Oxford Movement (not to be confused with the recent Oxford Group), priest and Cardinal, great stylist of the 19th century, keen analyst of men and doctrines (Chief books: Apologia pro Vita Sua; The Present Position of Catholics in England; A Grammar of Assent; Essay on the Development of Doctrine; The Idea of a University).

Catholics In History THEOBALD MATHEW Father Mathew is remembered as the "Apostle of Temperance." He inaugurated what has become a worldwide temperance movement and his influence is still felt in many countries and many lands. He carried his crusade for two and a half years throughout the United States, and it is estimated that during his career he gave the total abstinence pledge to 1,000,000 persons.

Bishop Cohen also told Bishop Yu-Pin that his native Diocese of Rurum in Holland has adopted the Vinariate of Tsing Tao in China, to which it sends the sum of 40,000 gulden each year, to help with the Vicariate's work.
