Just even this is not much satisfaction for the heavily veiled Hans. There is something strangely familiar about her, don't you think? Or is it just my imagination?

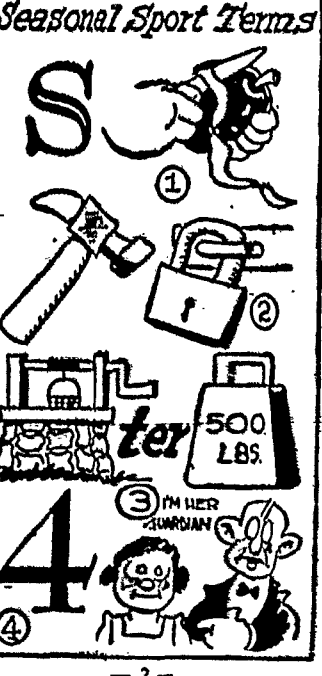

Change BALL to PINS in five moves.

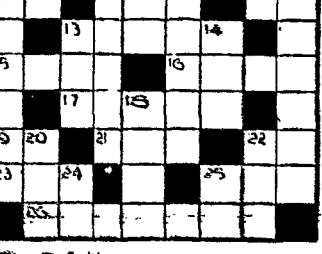
Here is a sentence with one of the letters left out wherever it occurs, and all the words run together. Can you read it?

CROSSWORD PUZZLE



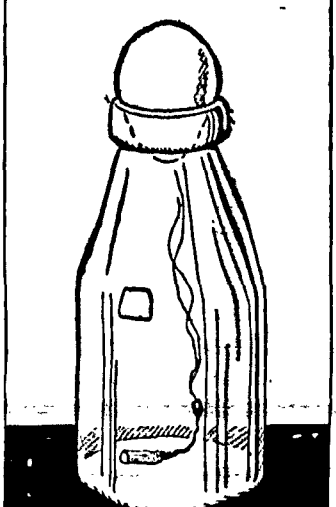
