AUBURN In a basketball match which opened the inter-circle activities with Circle 200 of Geneva, the Auburn Squires triumphed.

Department of Catholic Action Study, of which the Most Rev. Samuel A. Stritch, Archbishop of Milwaukee, is Episcopal Chairman. "Activities of the N.C.W.C. Family Life Section" by the Rev. Dr. Edgar Schrader, O.S.B., Director of the Section, and treatments of a half-dozen separate topics under "Our Common Catholic Interests."
