

Evil Literature Ban Urged by Name Men

Thirty lead of the increasing amount of evil publications now appearing on newsstands and in store libraries, members of the Rochester Diocese Unit of the Diocesan Holy Name Union at the January 27 meeting held at St. Michael's Hall took steps to check the sale of such literature.

In a resolution adopted, the Holy Name delegates declared: "This organization goes on record as a body and voices its objection to the distribution of sub-literature for the reason that this matter be referred to the National Catholic Welfare Conference in Washington."

Lively discussion preceded the resolution's adoption. It was voted by some that the matter should be handled as a part of the League of Women's program. Experiences of individual Holy Name societies in combating the evil were recounted.

Bishop Lauds Boy Scouts

Cites Contribution Scout-ing Makes to American Citizenship

Attendance at Mass was held up as a possible "one good deed a day for God" by the Most Rev James E. Kearney, D. D., Bishop of Rochester, addressing more than 625 Catholic Boy Scouts in the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart Sunday.

Members of the 22 Catholic scout troops in Rochester attended a Mass celebrated by Bishop Kearney and approved the altar rail to receive Holy Communion as their contribution to Scout Sunday.

Contrasting the scene before him with that of youth movements in some other countries, the Bishop said:

"These countries take great pains to see that religion does not take a great part in the training of a young boy."

The Bishop thanked God that the Boy Scouts of America have encouraged as one of the principal events of the year what was taking place that morning.

Stating that the outstanding contribution to the success of the American republic has been the recognition of the hand of God guiding the destinies of men, the Bishop commended the Scout organization on what it is doing to develop American citizenship.

In his suggestion that the Catholic scouts report once a day to their "Supreme Scout Master," Bishop Kearney told them that their duty is to do what God would like on an additional blessing.

Assisting at the Mass and in looking after the Scouts were the Rt. Rev. Edgar V. Byrne, pastor of the Pro-Cathedral, his assistants, the Rev. John P. O'Brien and the Rev. Earl C. Rice, and the Rev. Joseph B. Vogt, diocesan chaplain of the Catholic boy scouts.

A breakfast for the scouts and scouters was held in Sacred Heart School hall, where the Bishop again addressed them and they heard messages from W. Arthur McKinney, scout executive, Harry B. Crowley, diocesan chairman, and George B. McAvoy, chairman of the Rochester area.

Catholic scouts throughout the diocese observed Scout Sunday at services in churches in their communities.

Total receipts for the year amounting to \$10,927, were composed of the following items: Sunday offerings and subscriptions, \$11,000.48; pew rent, \$1,880.00; Chancery collections and Propagation of the Faith, \$610.47; cemetery receipts including \$325.00 in encumbrances, \$1,220.00; Cash on hand Jan. 1, 1937, including \$3,343.60 in cemetery endowments; fund \$3,488.20; various other items \$1,495.94.

The statement showed that in addition to payment of current expenses for the year, \$2,000.00 was paid on church indebtedness and \$633.50 was paid on new heating equipment for St. Agnes School.
