### Bishop Foery Says Faith Guards U. S.

#### Baneful Ideals Barred by Men's Duty To God, Bishop Tells Club

America is protected against those "ideals and policies that are tearing the world apart today," by the bulwark of men here realizing their responsibility to God, the Most Rev. Walter A. Foery, Bishop of Syracuse told more than 500 persons at the annual fathers' and sons' banquet at St. Margaret Mary's parish hall, Tuesday evening.

The affair was sponsored by the Men's Club of St. Margaret Mary's Church.

"As we look abroad," the youthful priests and native Rochesterian said, "we see a world torn and troubled by all kinds of ideals and policies and we are worried lest they inflame America. Have no fear those ideals will threaten America, for into they cannot live when men hold the ideal of responsibility to God."

Bishop Foery stressed the ideals upheld by Washington and pledged for spiritual and educational training of youth to equip them to maintain those ideals in the America of tomorrow.

Close relationship between child and parent was urged by other speakers, prelates and priests of this diocese, many of them classmates of Bishop Foery's at St. Bernard's Seminary.

At the speakers' table were the Rt. Rev. Magr. William M. Hart, V.G., the Rt. Rev. Magr. William J. Bergan, Chancellor; the Rt. Rev. Joseph E. Grady, of St. Bernard's Seminary; and the Reverend Fathers Charles R. Euston, pastor of St. Margaret-Mary's; Edward T. Moagher, John B. Sullivan, Arthur A. two Chinese boys, Stanislaus, Benedict, one Chinese, one boy, Mary Joseph, Fifth grade, Chinese girl, Mary Agnes, Second grade, Chinese boy, Edward Joseph, First and Second grades, Chinese girl, Mary Dolores.

Two schools, Corpus Christi and St. Peter and Paul, both of Rochester, finish in a tie for second place with six ransoms each. "I'll bet you would be interested in knowing the names of these real true missionaries. They are Julia Chovel, Mary Hibbard, Mary Jane Hansell, and Barbara and Dorothy O'Donnell. Perhaps you, too, would like to start such a club. I think it is a swell idea.

There are a number of us this week. St. Augustine's and St. Andrews also finish neck and neck. From St. Augustine's we learn that the Sixth grade wishes a little black boy called John Valentine and the Fourth grade wishes a little Chinese girl named Mary Bernadette. The Third Grade, though, social, have chosen a little Japanese girl calling her Mary Katherine.

Last but by no means least are four others with a ransom apiece. Third grade won the baby. We got ahead and finally won. We were very glad and we named the baby James Edward.
