New Radio Contact With Latin Nations Seen Significant

(By N.W.C. News Service)

Washington, A new chapter in the unfolding foreign policy of the United States might well be written around the inauguration of a short wave broadcasting channel linking the two Americas.

The opening exchange of greetings between this country and Brazil was much more important than appears on the surface. It marks the beginning of a definite move to contact the Nazi and fascist propaganda from European countries which have up to this time had a free hand in radio communication with Brazil and other South American countries.

The "good neighbor" policy passed the test of this latest development. For the first time, the United States has attempted to combat the Nazi influence in Latin America. The good neighbor policy of the Army, which demonstrated that distance between South and South America has not vanished. Radio communication is now to be used to cement the good neighbor relationship.

In a message from the initial broadcast, Sumner Welles, Under Secretary of State, said:

"These events in the cultural and artistic field will fail to be bound to the imagination of the American people. They have a far-reaching significance for the United States and the Latin American continent.

Against the background of existing conditions, this becomes more than a formal diplomatic gesture. For among the United States has been different to the settlement of German, Italian and Japanese emigrants in South American countries. But in the perspective of world affairs, and the fascist policies of these countries, the situation assumes a different aspect. The Monroe Doctrine was set up to block European imperialism in South America. The good neighbor policy might prove to be the landmark against the spread of ultra-right European political doctrines in the same region.

Communism in Pictorial

Communism enters the picture and appears in no more favorable light than the attempt of the Mexican government to put restrictive laws upon foreign oil companies operating in that country. It has been alleged that the prime mover in this attempt is an avowed Communist who is a member of the State Department. He is taking directions from Moscow. The foot-hold communism has gained in Mexico cannot be doubted.

From the Washington viewpoint, however, by the latest press conference, the ground had gained as the foe of Nazism. The talk of trade relations between that country and the United States has completely died down.

Isolation Fades

The upshot of the recent events is that the United States is beginning to take cognizance of the spread of these anti-democratic forces in the Western Hemisphere. It is rapidly disappearing totalitarianism, whatever its brand is trying to gain a foothold in the Latin American countries in a process of infiltration and although little might have been accomplished in this direction in the United States, the country might eventually find some of its neighbors arrayed against democracy.

Appearance at least indicates that a possibility is not unattainable. It might explain the new naval armament program, the new marine program, as well as the goodwill flights by air and the opening of new radio channels.

Pushes Adult Education

Senator Hatch of New Mexico has taken the initiative in proposing to carry out one recommendation of the Advisory Committee on Education whose report was recently sent to Congress by the President. He has introduced a bill to appropriate \$50,000,000 to be distributed to the States for adult education especially in citizenship over a period of five years.

In submitting his proposal, Senator Hatch took occasion to commend the work done in Mississippi by the National Council of Catholic Women and other private organizations. He said of his measure: "I am interested at the moment in focusing public attention on the need of developing a national educational social training among the adult citizens of our country to the problems confronting us."

There is not much prospect, however, that any definite action will be taken on this or other legislative proposals to carry out the recommendations of the committee.

Congress is showing a disposition to fold its tents and go home. Controversial questions are being shunted aside. Even the way and hour legislation faces a very dubious outlook.

New Drives Begin On Evil Books

Denver and Milwaukee Groups Start Campaigns On Fifth-in-Print

DENVER (AP)—Calling upon the clergy throughout Colorado to cooperate actively in the campaign against indecent reading matter, the Most Rev. Urban J. Vehr, Bishop of Denver, says "many magazines, books and pamphlets placed within the easy reach of the reading public have no reason for existence except to depict vice alluringly and ruin innocence and morality."

Stating that the lit. Rev. McGr. Hugh L. McManamon has had considerable success in securing the cooperation of drug store owners in the area of Denver who promise to read their book and magazine racks of salacious and indecent literature and that he has found that the vast percentage of owners of magazine and book stores are willing to operate in eliminating the salacious if their attention is called to the matter, Bishop Vehr adds:

"As a result of this experience it is suggested that you try to secure the cooperation of the religious leaders in your community in a joint understanding and campaign. That you contact by personal visit or letter the owners of drug stores and magazine stands, explaining the movement and asking them to cooperate in removing this objectionable literature."

"That you try to secure editorial commitment in favor of the movement in the daily press. That you enlist the active cooperation of various societies, e.g., Holy Name Society, Parent-Teacher organizations, Knights of Columbus, A. L. A. societies, etc. These organizations can assist in protesting to owners of book and magazine stands against the continued display or sale of objectionable reading material which is not only contrary to moral law but also to state statutes. The parents of school children particularly will be vitally interested."

MILWAUKEE (AP)—Announcing that lead and indecent publications must go the Wisconsin Council of Catholic Women has launched a drive to rid newsstands and book racks of off-putting publications.

A letter sent to all groups of Catholic women affiliated with the State Council says that "a few years ago it did not seem possible that in the near future there would be such a change in the motion picture industry and that it can be the same in the case of salacious reading of there is a conscientious concerted effort on the part of parents particularly."

The Catholic Herald-Chronicle is advertising and selling a trade publication as follows on the subject of "Smut on the Newsstands."

It is only a matter of time before the unscrupulous publisher will grasp the business and governmental interference in publishing becomes more than a remote specter.

Before that action becomes necessary it is plainly the obligation of reputable publishers and publicists who have come to a final court in judging what is fit to print, to curb this rampant epidemic of smut of the newstand.

PROVIDENCE (AP)—At the time the latest issue of the Providence Journal went to press a total of 164,332 persons had signed the petition to read or buy publications listed as offensive in the campaign being conducted here against indecent literature.

At the same time the number of Assistant registrars who have pledged not to handle the objectionable publications had risen to 3,250.

Proposed Measure To Forbid War Aid

WASHINGTON (AP)—A resolution proposing amendment of the Espionage Act to prohibit the making of contributions to any government or citizen of a nation engaged in war otherwise than as an ally of the United States has been introduced in the House of Representatives.

The measure, sponsored by Representative Collins of Mississippi, would outlaw all relief to non-combatants even medical aid and the Red Cross. Another resolution introduced by Rep. Collins would make it illegal for the United States acting directly to engage in relief.

An analysis of the orders showed that a higher percentage of new mail subscriptions, new carrier subscriptions and renewals of annual small orders was obtained than in any previous Crusade.

Crusade headquarters is well pleased with the results. Priests' committee lauded.

Appreciation is again being extended to the Priests' Committee, a new feature of the Crusades which aided considerably in advancing its progress and to the parish priests and good Sisters in the schools who did so much to assist the Crusade.

FEARS STATE EDUCATION CONTROL

HARRISBURG, PA. (AP)—Warning against current trends toward governmental control of higher education was voiced here by the Rev. Edward V. Stanford, O.S.A. President of Villanova College in his presidential address made at the annual meeting of the Association of College Presidents of Pennsylvania.

Father Stanford declared that while there may be no thought of control in the mind of a governmental agency there have been increasing encroachments in the past few years of internal interest in higher education on the part of Federal and State governments that give rise to well-founded fears that we are heading us ultimately for governmental control of higher education. The current tendencies, he said, are paving the way to make it easy for governmental agencies in the future to assume such control if they are so minded.

POPE NAMES AUXILIARY BISHOP, CREATES DIOCESE

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Very Rev. Mag. William A. Griffin has been appointed to the titular See of Sanavato and to the office of Auxiliary Bishop to the Most Rev. Thomas J. Walsh Archbishop-elect of Newark and a new Diocese of Saginaw has been created in the State of Michigan, according to a word received at the Apostolic Delegation here.

Bishop-elect Griffin at present holds the offices of Irremovable rector of the Church of St. Michael, Jersey City, Diocese of Newark, and of the Propagation of the Faith of the Association of the Holy Childhood and of the Catholic Students Mission Crusade. In 1933 he was National Treasurer of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in the Continental United States and raised to 112 with the creation of the Saginaw diocese. The new diocese in the Province of Detroit, of which the Most Rev. Archbishop Edwin Mooney is Metropolitan will be made up of thirteen counties in the Grand Rapids diocese and taken from the Archdiocese of Detroit.

FALL RIVER MASS (AP)—Termining the picture, "Hearts of Spain," the Rev. Felix B. Childs, chaplain of the local council of the Knights of Columbus, issued a statement applauding the action of the local authorities in banning the picture.

Father Childs' statement came as a reply to the public resolution adopted by the Fall River Ministerial Association, in which Police Chief Abel J. Violette and Mayor Edward C. Murphy were charged with the suppression of free speech and free assembly in forbidding the showing of the film and the address of a speaker.

"It has long been established," Father Childs said, "that 'Hearts of Spain' is a Communist picture produced by the Russians for Communist propaganda."

Wrestler Eye-Witness Of Priests' Slaying

NEW YORK (AP)—An eye-witness account of the burning alive of 20 monks and three priests in a church at Cordoba, Spain, by Communists and Anarchists, was told here this week by Wladek Zyzyko, wrestler, on his return to the United States after four years abroad.

Mr. Zyzyko said he was giving exhibitions in Spain when the outbreak of the revolution found him at Cordoba. One day, he declared, he saw a mob of Communists and Anarchists forcing priests and monks, all of whom had been stripped of their clothing, through the streets in a mock religious procession. Food and water had been denied them for several days, he said he was informed.

Bishop Kearney in Radio Talk Launching Discussion Program Declares Communism Is Resulting in 'National Treason'

It is high time that the mask was stripped from Godless Communism propaganda which calls itself intellectual progress, liberalism or what you will," declared the Most Rev. James H. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, in the first of a series of radio talks over Station WJAZ, Sunday.

"The Bishop's radio address on 'The Primordial Struggle' launched the diocese-wide discussion club program being sponsored by the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine during the Lenten season.

Declaring that communistic propaganda can now "get a hearing in the halls of our universities and, in some parts of the country, even in high schools," the Bishop warned that "we have very serious national treason in our midst."

Complete text of the Bishop's address follows: "The opening of the series of discussions planned for this Lenten season by the Study Clubs of the diocese, I can think of no more timely introduction than the words of the reigning Pontiff, who has pointed out so clearly the reality and the bitterness of what the prospectus of our discussion clubs call the 'Primordial Struggle'."
