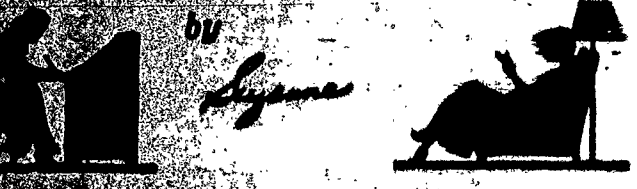

The statement on the Equal Rights Amendment, presented by the National Council of Catholic Women at the Senate Committee Hearing, February 7, 1938, is as follows:

The National Council of Catholic Women has consistently opposed the Equal Rights Amendment at each recurring session of Congress since its introduction for the following reasons:

We do not favor it, because it is a fundamental principle to affirm what was included in our protest presented at the Senate Committee Hearing in February 1934.

The term "Equal Rights" as used by the advocates of this Amendment is a palpable misnomer. It is interpreted to mean identical rights for men and women (and this is the interpretation upon which it is based) - that is, the Amendment is in the face of fact, science and philosophy. Men and women are not identical beings...

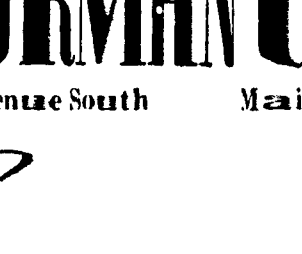

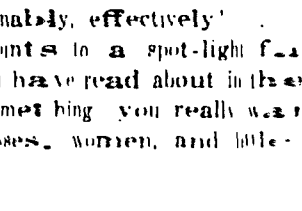
