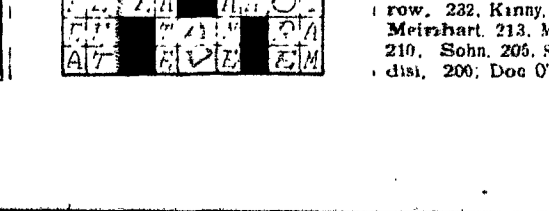
IN INSTALLMENT IV
