'Franco Will Win' Seminarists Told

Assisting at Mass celebrated in the oriental rite in the morning and hearing an inside story on the civil war in Spain from a noted Catholic layman just returned from there furnished faculty and students of St. Bernard's Seminary with a busy day, last Sunday. The Mass in the Ukrainian rite, an adaptation of the oriental rite according to St. John Chrysostom, was celebrated by the Rev. Richard Pobutsky, pastor of St. Peter and Paul's Church, Auburn. The story on Spain was brought by Paul McGuire of London, noted detective fictionist and keen student of Catholic Action development throughout the world who expressed the opinion that Franco is sure of success in the Spanish war. Faculty Members Assisted: Father Pobutsky was assisted in the Mass by the Rev. Dr. Edward J. Byrne and the Rev. Dr. Wilfrid Craugh, as assistant priests, and the Rev. Mr. Stephen Krizanski and the Rev. Mr. Francis Vogt, as deacons. Several young men from the Auburn, Ukrainian parish assisted as servers. Music of the Mass was supplied by a choir of 55 voices from St. Peter and Paul's Church, Auburn. The vestments worn were supplied by Father Pobutsky.

Mr. McGuire's knowledge of the Spanish situation was gained from a personal trip to that country where he was sent by the English Hierarchy to investigate conditions for the return of the Basque children to territory captured by Franco. He said that on finding conditions favorably he so reported and when the Basque children returned they were given a rousing welcome by grown-ups and children of Spain. The children already in Spain particularly expressed pleasure over the return of the refugees. Never to Return. There are 20,000 to 25,000 Basque children who have been sent by the Reds to Russia and Mexico, said Mr. McGuire "and there is no hope of their ever returning." Mr. McGuire before coming to this country to get first-hand knowledge of the workings of the National Catholic Welfare Conference and the Catholic Church Extension Society, made extensive study of the J. O. C. movement in Belgium and the O. C. in Holland. In his talk at the Seminary, McGuire reviewed his topic treated in January 1938 issue of "Columbia on the Christian Revolution" that is being worked out by the "Christian Worker Youth in Belgium, the M. O. C."
