This reproduction of the scene at Emmaus following the Resurrection is a fresco in the Cathedral at Lwow, Poland, executed by the celebrated Polish artist, J. H. de Rosen, who at present is in this country and will do some work here. Mr. de Rosen was commissioned by His Holiness Pope Pius XI to do the murals in his private chapel at Castelgandolfo. The Gospel according to St. Luke records how, following His Resurrection, Our Lord appeared to two of His Disciples, and they did not know him. Arrived at Emmaus, Our Lord sat with His Disciples while they took their evening meal. "And it came to pass," the Gospel says, "that he was at table with them, he blessed and brake, and gave to them. And their eyes were opened, and they knew him and he vanished out of their sight."

Adoration Society Termed 'Perfect'

"An organization that forms itself for no other purpose than the adoration of Christ is about as perfect an organization as we can think of," the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, told more than 300 Neoturnal Adoration Society members at their Corporate Communion Breakfast Sunday morning in Powers Hotel. Praising an impressive sight the men approached the altar rail at 7 o'clock Mass in St. Patrick's Church celebrated by Bishop Kearney before going to the hotel. Furnishing dynamo. The Bishop in his sermon at St. Patrick's termed the Society "The Power house of Catholic Action in the diocese." "When you kneel silently, devotedly in your nightly vigils before the Blessed Sacrament, you have set the adoration of Christ in the highest degree. You generate the power for all other manifestations of Catholic Action that we see all about us," the Bishop said. President William J. Hauser presided at the breakfast and was assisted by Edward J. Loeb, general chairman. The Rev. Leo C. Mooney, pastor of St. Patrick's and spiritual director of the Society, speaking at the breakfast welcomed the Society to St. Patrick's and spoke of the impressiveness of the reception of Holy Communion by such a large body of men. "Important Factor." The Bishop in the principal address said that the "philosophy of adoration of Christ is the important factor in the life of the present day and an important contribution to the welfare of the community in which we live."

Calvary Rock Seen In Renewed Shrine

The restoration of the Shrine of the Holy Sepulchre at the right of the Holy Sepulchre at Jerusalem has uncovered a part of the rock of Calvary and this is now exposed to the view of pilgrims. Part of the rock was planned to be carried off by the Franciscan Fathers, official custodians of the Sanctuaries of the Holy Land in Palestine was the restoration of the Shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows in the Latin chapel. The statue of Our Lady of Sorrows has been enclosed in the shrine, giving a more impressive effect to the attitude of a mother mourning the death of her only son. In removing the original bar for this shrine a part of the rock of Calvary was laid bare. It is preserved beneath the altar of the shrine enclosed in glass.

SCHOLARSHIP OFFERED BY K. C. At St. Bonaventure For Boys In Area

One of ten scholarships for Catholic Colleges in the state is available for boys in this diocese. It is announced today by the New York State Council, Knights of Columbus Scholarship committee. The scholarship is open at St. Bonaventure College, at St. Bonaventure, N. Y., where the examination will be held on July 1 at 9 A. M. An applicant for a scholarship must be a Knight of Columbus, or a son, brother, daughter or sister of a living or deceased member of a council located in the State of New York and in such circumstances which the scholarship provides, the applicant would not be able to procure a Catholic College education. The scholarships offered by the Knights of Columbus provide payment of tuition only at \$50 per year for four years. Councils in the area from which applications will be accepted for freshman class only are: Binghamton, Norwich, Waverly, Endicott, Elmira, Oneonta, W. Winfield, Cooperstown, Ithaca, Geneva, Seneca Falls, Cortland, Auburn, Canandaigua, Corning, Hornell, Elmira, Allegany, Dunkirk, Penn Yan, Warsaw, Salamanca, Wellsville, Jamestown, Olean, Rochester, Brockport, Batavia, Azbion, Medina, Newark, Danville, Buffalo, Lackawanna, Hamburg, Lockport, Tonawanda and Niagara Falls. Applicants must be of good moral character, recommended by their pastors and qualified by preliminary education to enter the freshman class of a college chartered by the Regents of the State of New York. These applications must be filed on or before June 30. This is the 25th year of this State Council activity, commenced at the suggestion of the late Dr. John G. Coyne, past state deputy.
